
McHENRY LODGE No. 800 - TWIN LAKES CHAPTER DEMOLAY





“I Didn't Know That.....”

Dueling was a popular way to maintain honor following a perceived insult in early Kentucky. Masons were not exempt from this illegal practice. Perhaps the most well-known duel involves Henry Clay and Humphrey Marshall, a cousin of Chief Justice John Marshall. Clay, a member of Lexington #1 (PGM 1820-21) had defended Aaron Burr on charges of treason in 1806. Both Clay and Marshall were elected to the Kentucky Legislature in 1808 and were in opposition in a debate when Marshall called Clay “a liar”. Clay challenged Marshall to dual which was fought with pistols on January 19, 1809 across the Ohio River in Indiana just down from Louisville. Three shots from each resulted in Clay being wounded in the thigh and Marshall with a slight abdomen wound. One would think that a lesson was learned.



Henry Clay entered into another duel with John Randolph on April 8, 1826, but this time in Washington D.C. Both were U.S. Senators, both were Masons. Again, Clay considered something said on the Senate floor insulting and a duel was proposed resulting in Clay's two shots and Randolph's one shot doing no damage. Randolph refused to fire a second time and Clay called off the duel. The two onetime enemies walked to the center and shook hands. Thus this incident earned the tag, “The Duel That Wasn't”.

Both a Kentucky Grand Jr. Warden and a Kentucky Grand Master while serving in those capacities were involved in dueling. During 1814, Dr. James Overton, Jr. Grand Jr. Warden and Past Master at Lexington #1, sent a challenge to John Tilford (Davies #22). The challenge was carried by William Cochran, Overton's second, and also a member of Davies #22. Tilford denied having done anything in any way to harm Overton. As a result, Cochran was suspended from Davies #22; however, upon appeal, on September 3, 1814, the Grand Lodge suspended the action of Davies #22, and ordered Cochran to receive a reprimand as to his actions, which ended the episode.

More seriously for the Grand Lodge of Kentucky was in early August 1818, when the Grand Master Dr. William H. Richardson and Dr. Benjamin Dudley, a Past Master of Lexington #1, decided to settle an argument with weapons. According to Kentucky Masonic historian Charles Snow Guthrie, both men were professors in the medical department of Transylvania University. A disagreement over professional matters deteriorated into personal attacks. The duel was fought near Lexington with Dr. Dudley left unscathed, but Grand Master Richardson fell with a severed inguinal artery. Dr. Dudley assisted Richardson's surgeon to stop the flow of blood, and Grand Master Richardson opened the Grand Lodge on August 31. However, the next day Richardson “retired” from his chair and a resolution was presented that the duel was ‘repugnant to the principles of Freemasonry’. Both men were required to appear before the Grand Lodge on September 3, to answer for their ‘departure from the principals of the craft’. Both men were suspended but evidently restored to membership in September 3, 1819. Both men continued to work side by side at Transylvania College as friends and brothers for several years.

Another duel fought on Kentucky soil, but this time by a famous Tennessee Mason, Andrew Jackson, who would later become Grand Master of Tennessee and President of the United States. Both Andrew Jackson and Charles Dickenson were rival horse breeders who cared very little about each other. Dickenson claimed that Jackson refused to pay a lost horse race bet. Dickenson went on to say that Jackson's wife was a bigamist, having married Jackson before her first husband had completed the divorce. The duel was fought in Logan County, Kentucky at Harrison Mills on the Red River on May 30, 1806. The result was Jackson killed Charles Dickenson. Jackson also was wounded. It seems Jackson's wife was far more newsworthy than the killing of Dickenson as ‘men of honor’ were expected to defend their integrity. Thus Jackson, who had already served in the Tennessee Senate, was never tried for the killing of Dickenson and his future in politics remained secure. ---What do you think?
