The Grand Lodge will be holding a Ritual Competition to recognize the importance of ritual excellence within our Commonwealth. The purpose of the competition is to inspire lodges to focus on meaningful ritual to deepen members' and candidates' experiences, and to raise the standard of ritual excellence in our craft.

We know that many of you are excellent ritualists or aspiring to be, and we hope you will participate in the competition and be recognized for your efforts. The Kentucky Monitor by Henry Pirtle will be used as the primary source for judging purposes in the 2021-2022 competition. The three categories of the competition will consist of the Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft, and Master Mason's charge. This competition is open to EA's, FC's & MM's for the EA charge, FC's & MM's for the FC charge, and MM's for the MM charge.

The Ritual Committee will have further details on the program and how it will be conducted. Brethren whose interest is ritual proficiency and techniques will find the ritual competition most informative and beneficial. It is our hope that this will be a way of encouraging brothers to tackle new roles and passages.

2022, A Shemitah Year (Hebrew Year 5782)

Jewish beliefs teach that there is a cycle of years. The cycle occurs in sevens and the 7th year is called the Shemitah year. It was a year of BLESSING. During the Shemitah year no farming or harvesting was to be done and the land was allowed to rest. In Genesis 1 we are told of what GOD created in 6 days, but it is often overlooked that on the 7th day He created rest. The Shemitah year was a year of blessing for those who obeyed GOD by resting. Those who did not observe the Shemitah rest would come into judgment.

The literal meaning of Shemitah is "the year of release." After 7 Shemitah years (49 years) the next year (50th) is the year of Jubilee. There was great anticipation for the year of Jubilee. Debts were released and slaves were allowed to go free.

There is blessing and chaos in a Shemitah year (Deuteronomy 30:19). Here are a few modern examples of Shemitah years and some of the blessings and chaos that happened: The Turks took over the land of Israel (1916-1917), The Great Depression (1929), The Dust Bowl in Oklahoma, Kansas, and Texas (1934-41), The Stock Market Crash (1937-38), Israel becomes a nation (1948), The Golan Heights were returned to Israel during the 6 Day War (1967), Abortion was legalized (1973), Operation Moses began bringing Ethiopian Jews back to Israel (1984).

It is important to remember that the Hebrew calendar does not always start at what most of us consider the "start time," meaning it sometimes starts in August, September, or October. I wanted to add a little something different to this month's article just to make you think about another perspective.

MASONIC LIBRARY AND MUSEUM ASSOCIATION COVINGTON SCOTTISH RITE "I Didn't Know That....."

At the age of 13 years Canadian born William Wallace Dudley (1851-1938) held an apprenticeship to a maker of ship chronometers, which afterwards led him to the United States where Dudley began his career as a model maker by Waltham Watch Company. He was thereafter employed by several watch manufacturers before retiring at the age of 69 years as both designer and superintendent from the Hamilton Watch Company in Pennsylvania.

Several years before his retirement in 1920, Dudley began actively working on a Masonic pocket watch idea, which would include Masonic symbols in its workings. Dudley was a longtime York Rite and Scottish Rite Mason and wanted to produce a high quality pocket watch that reflected his interests. The design would include: the letter G, the Holy Bible, a slipper, the trowel, plumb, level, with the square and compass in a gold case. Many parts would be utilized from other watch companies. The Model 1 was a size 14, open face was granted a patent in 1923. It is estimated that less 1400 of this model was made. Many were later melted down when gold reached a premium.

Demand for a smaller pocket watch led to a size 12 in both the Model 2, with a gold-filled case and later, the Model 3 with some minor changes in the Masonic symbols. The watches sold for \$125.00 to \$250.00, a lot of money for the average Mason in that period, and competition was heavy. The struggling company was hit hard with the invention of the 'wrist watch', which quickly became popular and Dudley's dream came to an end. On February 28, 1925, Dudley filed for bankruptcy. He had lost nearly everything and returned to work at the Hamilton Watch Company where he retired at age 80.

P. W. Baker Company continued to produce the watch from 1925 to 1935. It is estimated that fewer than 2600 Dudley watches were produced between the 1920 and 1935 period. The XL Watch Company of New York continued to manufacture them from 1935 to 1976.

Because of the rarity of the Dudley watch, it became a popular item with collectors and Masons alike. Collectors seek to obtain all three models. Today a near perfect Dudley watch with a box can easily sell for as much as \$6000.00. However with the 'not so perfect' watches, the price can drop considerably as parts are difficult to find.



So how does this all tie in with Kentucky? The Wadsworth Watch Case Company (1892-1953) Newport, Kentucky-Dayton, Kentucky, began by manufacturing gold-filled cases for watch manufacturers and in 1902, expanded to 14 caret solid gold cases. Wadsworth Watch Case Company became known for its superior quality and workmanship and was one of the leading manufacturers producing watch cases for the industry.

They fabricated many of the cases for the Dudley Masonic pocket watches. A large number of their employees came from Dayton, Bellevue, and Newport, Kentucky, including many Masons from the three Lodges in the area, specifically Robert Burns #163, Newport #358 (both in Newport) and Henry Barnes #607, in Dayton, Kentucky. Robert Burns #163 was the Mother Lodge of the other two. When Wadsworth sold to Elgin National Watch Company and closed its doors in 1953 it put a great hardship on the locale, particularly in Dayton where the plant was located. It took many years for the area to recover. The three Masonic Lodges are now reunited in Newport as Trinity #163.

Donald M. Estes, a Past Grand Commander of Knights Templar of Kentucky (1989-90) was an avid collector of Masonic jewelry, particularly gold Masonic jewels. At the time of his death in July, 2009, he is said to have owned seven or eight Dudley watches in his collection. The National Watch & Clock Museum in Columbia, PA, has several Dudley watches for public view. The 1979 booklet William Wallace Dudley and his Masonic Watch by authors Jr. Victor Stoltz and E. H. Parker tells the complete story with great photos of the different models and parts, however the booklet is no longer in print.

Preserving The Past and Securing The Future

Preserving the past and securing the future --- a phrase and a motto that many of us, as Free and Accepted Masons are familiar with. But what does the phrase mean? And more importantly, what does it mean to Freemasons? To start a basic analysis of the phrase requires a definition of the terms contained therein. Preserve in its common usage is defined as the act of maintaining something in its original or existing state. As Freemasons we are familiar with our Ancient Charges and especially with the admonition that, "it is not within the authority nor the prerogative of any Mason, nor any body of Masons to stray from, alter or change the basic tenets of Masonry. The past simply refers to things that have occurred prior or before the current moment, The past to Freemasons is our heritage. To secure is to be free of threat; and, certain to remain or continue safe and unharmed. To the Freemason securing the future is possibly interpreted as exerting efforts to insure that our Fraternity remains safe from harm and stable for the ages. In essence, we as Freemasons are encouraged to maintain our Fraternity in its purest form so as to keep it intact for those that follow.

How do we do this? How do we preserve the past while working to secure the future? Ask three men and you will likely get three answers. And, that it is exactly what makes our Fraternity strong. For, in each of the answers and responses to this most rhetorical of questions there is useful insight, personal experience and knowledge to be gained. We are all familiar with the concept of planning, both short-term and long-term. We are at the precipice of one of the most important times in Freemasonry possibly since the end of World War II. Following the end of the Second World War fraternalism in all arenas saw a swell and a glutton. We now find ourselves on the opposite end of

that spectrum. All areas of Freemasonry are seeing declines in membership numbers...whether by the advancing age and deaths of our senior members, increased suspensions for non-payment of dues, or a decrease in petitions for membership. Whatever the underlying reason, the result is the same ... a continued reduction in our numbers. It is our task to preserve the past and secure the future. We have the tools and the resources to accomplish our task. We live in the day of instant communication. We have communities that are welcoming any and all types of community service and involvement with enthusiasm. I encourage each of you to support your Home Lodge. Volunteer to organize and chair an ad-hoc committee to develop and/or update your website and other social media platforms. Speak with your Master and offer to contact your local travel and tourism office to inquire about potential ways to assist your community as well as have your Lodge's information displayed on their site. You, who are Scottish Rite Masons, reach out to your Valley and offer to represent The Scottish Rite next spring at the presentation of the ROTC and JROTC Scottish Rite Awards. The opportunities are endless and each comes with the satisfaction of the knowledge that you are working and exerting your efforts to Preserve The Past and Secure The Future.

To paraphrase our Illustrious Brother John Glenn, "We can't relive our lives." Therefore, let's all strive to do what we can to insure the future of our Fraternity.
