The 208th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F.&A.M., will be held at the Galt House, Louisville, beginning at 8:45 A.M., Monday, October 15, 2007. Louisville is on Eastern Daylight Time.

The Master's Duty: To attend the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge. If unable to attend, to see that his Lodge is represented. Section 89 (6).

SECTION 12 (2). Representatives to Grand Lodge are the Master, or, in his absence the Senior Warden, or in his absence the Junior Warden, or in the absence of the Master and Wardens, the Secretary, by virtue of their respective offices. If they cannot attend:

SECTION 12 (3). An Elective Representative shall be a Permanent Member chosen by ballot from the members of his lodge, to represent it in case its Master, Wardens or Secretary cannot the communication of the Grand Lodge, and such representative shall be given a certificate of his election over the Lodge seal.

Failure to have your Lodge properly represented at two consecutive Annual Com-munications of the Grand Lodge may cause your charter to be arrested. (Sec. 89 [6]).

If you have lost or misplaced the certificate a duplicate may be ordered from the Grand Secretary.

The Master should see that a representative is elected. This makes five men eligible to represent your Lodge. One or two should always be on stand by, ready to go at a minute's notice should the one who is supposed to go cannot



SECTION 68. Double Pay or Pay Without Service. No Brother shall receive pay in a double capacity, nor per diem for the time he is not actually in attendance, unless lawfully excused, during the sittings of the Grand Lodge, or a committee thereof.

SECTION 71. Representatives, Receipts in Full Shown. Each representative shall exhibit to the Grand Treasurer the receipt of the Grand Secretary in full for all indebtedness of his Lodge to the Grand Lodge before he shall be paid mileage or per diem.

SECTION 72. No Pay If Indebtedness Remitted. No representative shall receive pay if his Lodge has not paid in full its indebtedness to the Grand Lodge, or if its dues have been donated or remitted; nor shall payment be made to one who vacates his seat without permission of the Grand Lodge.

SECTION 73. Whenever the roll is called, every representative or other member who is entitled to mileage and per diem, must answer for his Lodge, or to his name if not a representative. If any fail to answer he shall forfeit, or if paid, shall refund

the amount of his mileage and per diem. If he fails to do so, it shall be charged to his Lodge, which may collect it from him as dues.

The Grand Master or the Grand Secretary shall be the only officers with authority to excuse a representative from answering the roll call and then only for good cause shown by written request on a form provided.

SECTION 74. Answering for Another at Roll Call. Any brother who shall answer for another at any roll call shall forfeit his mileage and per diem and be guilty of unmasonic conduct.

Committee on Credentials will begin registering Representatives Sunday, October 14, at 1:00 PM, at a place so designated. Register upon arrival and avoid the rush on Monday morning. Registration will close on Tuesday, October 16, at 9:00 A.M.

A Current Dues Card will be necessary to register.

Visitors: Master Masons in good standing in their Lodge are welcome and urged to attend any or all sessions of the Grand Lodge.

Motel: Do not delay, write or phone the hotel for reservations before the deadline (September 18th). Be sure to state date and hour of your arrival when writing and that you are attending The Grand Lodge of Kentucky,

Election of Grand Officers. Tuesday morning, October 16 at 10:00 AM. Each elective Grand Officer, Past Grand Master, and the

Representative from each subordinate Lodge shall have one vote and no more; Past Masters shall have one vote collectively. No one shall vote by proxy (Section 20). Members entitled to vote will receive a voting ballot when they register. Please do not lose your ballot. **Duplicate ballots will not be issued.**

Mileage and Per Diem: Each representative shall exhibit to the Grand Treasurer the receipt of the Grand Secretary in full for all indebtedness of his Lodge to the Grand Lodge, before he shall be paid mileage or per diem. (Section 71). Be sure you contact your secretary and have this receipt in your possession before leaving home for the Grand Lodge.


Paymasters: Grand Treasurer, Virgil T. Larimore and his assistants will begin paying mileage and per diem Tuesday at noon.

Roll Call of Representatives-Warning: The last business of the Grand Lodge shall be to call the roll of members entitled to mileage and per diem. If any one entitled to mileage and per diem fails to answer without having been lawfully excused by the Grand Lodge, he shall forfeit, or if paid, shall refund the amount of his per diem. If he fails to do so, it shall be charged to his Lodge, which may collect it from him as dues. (Section 73).

To be excused one must obtain an excuse slip from the Grand Secretary or Grand Master stating day and time of excuse. Any time not served will be deducted from per diem unless authorized by the Grand Lodge to be paid in

OVER 200 KENTUCKY EDUCATORS NOW TRAINED IN THE MASONIC MODEL



Year two and now over two hundred educators have been trained in the Kentucky Masonic Model Program for Student Assistance to help identify children at risk.

Kentucky Masonry moved forward this year by adding a second training workshop and expanding the coverage area providing additional opportunities for teachers and administrators to attend the Kentucky Masonic Model.

The additional second workshop in Lexington, held at the Oleika Temple was host to 74 registered educators, just one short of the projected 75 goal set for the Lexington area.

The workshop held at the Masonic Homes Campus in Louisville had a goal of 100. Registration more than doubled its numbers in its second year with 110 as compared to the 48 in the original class in 2006.

The Masonic Model Student Assistance Program trains educators to be able to identify a child who may be at risk for destructive behaviors and what to do to turn them away from a negative cycle.

The Masonic Model program trains a team from within a school, because different individuals will notice different things and when a teams comes together to meet they can put a puzzle together to determine the seriousness of an issue a child may have.

This program is all about prevention and the means to which we can help prevent something bad from happing in a child's life. In the real of drugs, alcohol, violence, suicide it means keeping something bad or evil from happening or taking root in a child.

Kentucky Freemasons and Masons across our country are finding the means to offer their communities a method to prevent such a horror thru the Masonic Model Student Assistance Program. Already Kentucky has plans to increase the workshops to add two additional workshops in 2008 for a total of four, spread across Kentucky.

In Kentucky, in addition to the training, educators are also offered professional development hours and administrative leadership hours. The three day workshop grant's 21 hours credit of training hours of professional development or leadership to teachers and administrators from the Department of

This year 21 hours of Continuing Educational Units (CEU's) from the Department of Human Resources for Social Workers in school systems were available who attended. Eighteen certificates for CEU's were granted this summer. Notice of this program acceptance was only granted by the Human Resources Board in April 0f 2007.

Providing this training to schools districts at no cost can save a school a considerable amount of money in addition to the valuable training the Masonic Model provides. On the average, one (1) hour of professional development training outside the school district would an average \$50-75 per hour. Using the low average it would cost the district a registration fee of \$1050 to send an educator to a training of this type.

Teachers and administrators who have now attended the Masonic Model workshops are responding and have this to say about the program.

"I've been to a lot of conferences educating me about at-risk children, but this program actually gave me steps to take to do something about the problem instead of wringing my hands and saying 'Oh dear, what do I do about hi or her" Michelle McConnell, Crittenden County Middle School.

"As an educator, I am exposed to many training programs. This was the most worthwhile presentations I have attended ever during my tenure" Jeff Koshel, Jefferson County Public Schools.

"Because of what I learned this week, I will have a faculty meeting with an overview of this great program. I will strongly encourage my staff to attend future workshops. The benefit for teachers is the ability to affect at-risk students that they want to help. This program is excellent; I can't wait to implement this process at my school." Michelle Hart, Principal, E-town Independent.

"I have been in education for 14 years and this is the best PD I have ever attended!" Travis Frigler, Doss High School

"Absolutely the most helpful training I've encountered in all the years I've been trying to find ways to help intervene in the lives of children to prevent or address at risk behaviors" Linda Schumann, Crittenden County.

This last comment seems to sum up the program in a nut shell and says all there is to say about the second year for our Masonic Model program in Kentucky.

"I came with the intention of staying 1 day and returning to my office to my workload. I am still here at day 3, what does that tell you about my thoughts on this outstanding program. I have several ideas to use immediately with my staff one day one". Brenda Pirtte. Principal, Bluegrass Middle School.






