Amend of Appendix D (D: Assessment), and Section 38 of the Book of Constitutions as follows:

1) Amend: Appendix D. Assessment Which currently reads:

Assessments Levied, Conditions.

An assessment of six dollars and fifty cents a year for each member is levied on the membership of this Grand Jurisdiction for the operation, maintenance and improvement of the Masonic Homes of Kentucky and the same shall be paid to the Grand Secretary in the same manner and at the same time the annual assessments for the Grand Lodge are paid, and shall be turned over to the Grand Treasurer. Said assessment shall be paid to the Masonic Homes of Kentucky.

So as when Amended shall Read:

Appendix D. Assessment Assessments Levied, Conditions.

An assessment of six dollars and fifty cents a year for each member is levied on the membership of this Grand Jurisdiction for the Grand Lodge Preservation Fund, Masonic Youth Groups and Grand Lodge Long Term Budgetary Fund and the same shall be paid to the Grand Secretary in the same manner and at the same time the annual assessments for the Grand Lodge are paid, and shall be turned over to the Grand Treasurer. Said assessment shall be divided three dollars to the Grand Lodge Preservation Fund, 50 cents to the Masonic Youth Groups and three dollars to the Grand Lodge Long Term Budgetary Fund.

(All else to remain the same)

2) Amend Section 38 (10) Which currently reads: Section 38.(10)

Publishes Lodge Officers' Name-When.

The Grand Secretary shall publish in the Masonic Home Journal, not later than the month of March of each year, a list of the newly-elected Masters and Secretaries of the subordinate lodges which have been reported to him, together with their post office addresses and phone numbers.

So as when amended would delete this Section in its entirety.

Rational:

Since the Masonic Directory is available shortly after March 1 each year, the added expense of printing the directory in the Masonic Home Journal appears to be an unnecessary expense.

ITEM NO. 8 Section 104:

Business.

All lodge business shall be done in a lodge of Master Masons, excepting proficiency examinations and approval and work of the first and second degrees or the trial of Entered Apprentices or Fellow Crafts.

Amend to read:

Section 104. Business.

Lodge business may be conducted, at the discretion of the Worshipful Master, on the lowest degree represented. However, only Master Masons may vote or ballot on petitions for degrees or affiliation, by laws, trials and discipline, or general matters affecting the Lodge and where the Book of Constitutions extends the rights and privileges of Masonry to Master Masons only, or where they may only be conducted in a Lodge of Master

Entered Apprentices and Fellow Crafts may participate in debate only at the discretion of the Worshipful Master and may not participate in Masonic Funerals.

Proficiency examinations and approval and work of the first and second degrees or the trials thereof shall be performed in the degree in which said work is to be conducted, and no inferior degree shall be represented.

No Entered Apprentice shall be entitled to be present in or participate in a Lodge of Fellow Crafts, or a Fellow Craft in a Lodge of Master Masons until the requirements of Section 135 and 136 of the Book of Constitutions has been satisfied.

ITEM NO. 9 Section 143.

Time Between Degrees.

The time between petition and initiation or affiliation and ballot thereon, and the time between each degree is a minimum of one lunar month, and the Grand Master is not authorized to dispense with this time.

Amend to read:

Section 143.

Time Between Degrees.

The time between petition and initiation or affiliation and ballot thereon shall be a minimum of one lunar month. A candidate may advance from Entered Apprentice to Fellow Craft then to Master Mason as soon as he has satisfied the requirements in Section 135 and Section 136.

Rational:

This is good legislation.

- 1. The purpose of this amendment is to permit Lodges to proceed with work at called communications as soon as the candidate has learned his lecture to the satisfaction of his lodge, and to the satisfaction of Sections 135 and 136. Then he could receive his next
- 2. A military man who has been elected by their lodge and who is about to be shipped out, can with proper instructions be able to satisfy Sections 135 and 136. Submitted by:

A candidate for initiation, or affiliation in a Kentucky Lodge shall be a man of the age of twenty-one (21) years or more, and of good report.

Amend to read:

Section 119. Qualifications.

A candidate for initiation or affiliation in a Kentucky Lodge shall be a man of the age of twenty-one (21) years or more, and of good report, and be a citizen of the United States of America, by birth, or hold a valid naturalization certificate, recognized by the United States Government.

Due to the fact that there are more than 20,000,000, illegal Aliens, in the United States of America, and some in this state have already requested permission to join our fraternity in Kentucky.

One unfavorable ballot

In balloting on a petition, if only one negative appears, a second ballot shall immediately take place; if on the second ballot two or more negatives appear, the petitioner shall be declared rejected.

Qualifications of Applicant.

A candidate for initiation or affiliation in a Kentucky Lodge shall be a man of the age of twenty-one (21) years or more and of good report.

Amend to read:

Section 119.

Qualifications of Applicant.

A candidate for initiation or affiliation in a Kentucky Lodge shall be a man of the age of eighteen (18) years or more and of good report.

Reasons for Amendment:

- 1. At the age of eighteen, a young man is eligible to serve our country, if he so chooses, and put his life on the line and drafted
- 2. When a man turns eighteen, he can legally get married, without parental consent.
- 3. There is not much difference in maturity between an eighteen and a twenty-one year old.
- 4. At eighteen, a young man could begin his Masonic journey, and this could possibly help him to start on good life's path.
 - Eligible to vote.

The time between petition and initiation or affiliation and ballot thereon, and the time between each degree is a minimum of one lunar month, and the Grand Master is not authorized to dispense with this time.

Amend to read: Section 143.

Time Between Degrees.

The time between petition and initiation or affiliation and ballot thereon, and the time between each degree is a minimum of one lunar month, and the Grand Master is not authorized to dispense with this time. However, a Military Duty Waiver may be requested by a candidate/brother and granted by his home lodge.

(1) Military Duty Waiver

A candidate, who has been accepted and duly elected to a lodge, or an Entered Apprentice or Fellowcraft, MAY request a waiver of dispensation on the time between degrees from said lodge, if he meets the following criteria. Approval of the request is left up to the **DISCRETION AND SATISFACTION** of the lodge. Proper documentation will be sent to the Grand Lodge

- for official record. (a.) The candidate/brother is a member of the mili
 - tary. (b.) The candidate/brother has orders sending him
 - to a known combat zone. (c.) The candidate/brother's date to report for military duty prohibits him from concluding his degrees in the usual allotted time period.

MEMORANDUM

TO: LODGE SECRETARIES FROM: JOSEPH R. CONWAY SUBJECT: IRS LETTER DATE: 8/17/07

Your lodge should have recently received a letter from the IRS stating that you will have to electronically file your lodges return through them. This letter is a bit misleading. Under new law organizations with an income under \$25,000 will have to file an electronic card through the IRS website. However there are a few exemptions. Your lodge falls under one of the exemptions.

The letter we received states that the "exceptions to the e-Postcard filing requirement include organizations that are included in a group return; private foundations required to file Form 990-PF, Return of Private Foundation or Section 4947(a)(1) Trust Treated as a Private Foundation; and section 509(a)(3) supporting organizations required to file Form 990 or Form 990-EZ as described (in their letter). In addition, this filing requirement does not apply to churches, their integrated auxiliaries, and conventions or associations of churches".

We receive from the IRS each year a form to "group file" for the lodges who report their gross receipts for the year are under \$25,000; therefore the lodges of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky (who are under \$25,000) are exempt from any individual filing measures required by the Internal Revenue Service.

80-YEAR BELATED MASONIC FUNERAL



On May the 27th at 2:00 p.m. Greenup Lodge #89 fulfilled a belated request for a Masonic funeral for the family of James Edward Eastham, who departed this life on May 30, 1927. James was the grandfather of Larry Eastham and the great-grandfather of Grand Junior Warden L. Todd Eastham and K.C.C.H. Barry Eastham of the Greenup Lodge. In the research of family history, it was discovered that the first Eastham set foot on American soil in 1637 at the Jamestown settlement, and after a few generations had lived in Virginia, they began to migrate to other parts of the country, some to Pulaski Co. and other parts of the United States. The first to settle in Kentucky came in 1798 to Boyd County and is recorded in the Boyd County history as being the second oldest grave in Boyd County in 1828. There is a Masonic emblem on his gravestone. We have found that the vast majority of Eastham's were Masons wherever they settled. From the first generation in Kentucky until today there were 8 generations, 7 of them we have found in Masonic records. The 8th was Hartwell Chandler Eastham, and he would appear in the records from 1820 to 1846 if he were a Mason. We have not been able to

examine these dates yet, as they are so old that no one in this area has copies of them.

Lodge records from June 1st 1927 indicate that the lodge was called to a special meeting to confer the Masonic Rites on James Edward Eastham who departed this life on May 27th 1927, but could not travel to the funeral on account of the unseasonably high water, and then closed the lodge. When this record was found, the family then requested that this fulfilled by the lodge, who were happy to do so.

Barry Eastham served as Master pro tem. Larry Eastham served as Senior Warden pro tem. L.Todd Eastham served as Junior Warden pro tem. Robert Goliher served as Senior Deacon pro tem. John Messer served as Junior Deacon pro tem. Kerry Sluss as Senior Steward, Richard Patrick as Junior Steward, and Jesse Leadingham was the Tyler. Other family and friends were Jeff Bryant, Charles Stevens, Sherry Whitt, Irene Pruitt, who attended the first funeral in 1927, Charlene Eastham, Justin Eastham, Tessa Eastham, and other DeMolay representatives.


