



At the end of this month, based on reports received from each constituent lodge, we will again be assembling the statistics for the past year for the annual report from this office to the Delegates at the Annual Communication in October. While the number of suspensions for NPD will not be known until the Annual Returns from each lodge is certified, we do a monthly recapitulation of membership each month as the Monthly Activities Reports are received, and, at the present time (end of April), it looks encouraging. The initial survey of the Monthly Activity Reports indicates a potential loss of less than 900 members this year—much less than what we have experienced over the last several years. However, a projection based on the recapitulation results—and, again, subject to the number of suspensions at the end of June—shows the potential for a net gain in membership over last year. And this could all be accomplished simply by holding on to our present membership, and all without the added benefit of receiving new members. Wouldn't that be a great way to end this Masonic year and begin the next one?

So, Brother Secretaries, realizing the normal routine demands of the office you hold, I encourage you to make every extra effort possible to contact those members who are delinquent in their dues to encourage them to remain current and maintain their standing in the Fraternity. After all, the Fraternity must have meant something to them, or else they would not have bothered to petition in the first place.

NOTICE

Section 217 of the **Book of Constitutions** requires that all motions on resolutions pertaining to amendments of the Constitutions or Laws of the Grand Lodge shall be submitted in writing and presented to the Office of the Grand Secretary no later than August 15, prior to the Annual Communications.

NOTICE

Section 12 (3) of the **Book of Constitutions** requires that an Elective Representative be a Permanent Member chosen by ballot from the members of his lodge, to represent it in case its Master, Wardens or Secretary cannot attend the communication of the Grand Lodge, and such representative shall be given a certificate of his election over the lodge seal.

WAIVER OF JURISDICTION-FEES RETURNED

Most recently there have been several inquiries made to the Grand Lodge Office concerning the return of fees when a waiver of jurisdiction is granted by a Lodge which has a higher initiation fee than the Lodge making

the request for the waiver of jurisdiction.

Section 98(a) of the Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F&AM deals specifically to this matter and states:

"In all cases where the fee of the Lodge granting the waiver of jurisdiction is greater than the fee of the Lodge requesting the waiver the candidate shall pay to the Lodge which asks the waiver a fee equivalent to the fee he would have been required to pay had he petitioned the Lodge which granted the waiver. Immediately after the candidate is elected and initiated, the Secretary of the Lodge receiving the waiver shall send the difference in fees to the Lodge granting the waiver."

Simply put, when a Lodge receives a waiver of jurisdiction in favor of a candidate from a Lodge having jurisdiction, where the initiation fee of the Lodge granting jurisdiction is higher than the initiation fee of the Lodge that is requesting the waiver, the candidate pays the higher fee and the difference in the fees must be paid to the Lodge granting the waiver.

ANNUAL RETURNS

Before the end of May you should have received a packet from the Grand Lodge Office containing:

- 1. A form asking for information on members you may have in the Masonic Homes of Kentucky.
- **2.** A form certifying the representative of your lodge at our Grand Communication in October (in case the Master or one of the line Officers can not attend).
- **3.** A post card for you to complete and return to this office or you can simply e-mail the information to Christy at *Christy@grandlodgeofky.org*
- **4.** Instruction sheet for checking Annual Returns.

5. Activity Summary

I urge you to take care of this quickly, to assure adequate time to review and record the results before Grand Lodge.

Also, sometime in the latter part of July, you will receive a computer printout of your membership and the lodge's Annual Return. Please check this information very carefully for accuracy and return the Annual Return to the Grand Lodge as quickly as possible. It is not necessary to send the Annual Return and payment for the assessments to Grand Lodge at the same time. As soon as the Annual Return is received (after you have checked and corrected it, if necessary) we can then assemble the information in ample time to have it available to the membership at Grand Lodge. You may forward your check for assessments prior to September 1, deadline. It is very important the June Monthly Activity Report be received in the Grand

Lodge Office as soon as practical after the end of the month-before the tenth of July deadline, if possible.

The Office Staff hopes to have the yearly statistical information of each lodge entered into the computer and the Annual Returns completed by the last week in July. I know I can depend on the continued cooperation of the dedicated lodge secretaries of this Grand Jurisdiction to do their best to preserve and maintain a complete and accurate record of their lodge activities.

NOTICE OF REJECTION

Just a reminder to each lodge secretary to report to the Grand Lodge Office, on the proper form, any petitioner for the degrees who has been rejected by your lodge. I am not sure all lodge secretaries are aware they should report this activity. However, this information could be valuable to another lodge, should the one rejected attempt to petition another lodge at a later date. In case you do not have any of the Notice of Rejection Forms, you may order them from the Office of the Grand Secretary.

If you are utilizing the computer reporting system you can easily report a rejection online. Further, you will not need to fill out the paperwork and send it to this office if you do report it online.

OFFICIAL OUT-OF-STATE CORRESPONDENCE

Just a reminder, all official correspondence between Grand Jurisdictions must be transmitted through the Grand Lodge Office. This includes all request for demits, reinstatements, transfers, affiliation, waivers etc. Consequently, if you correspond directly with a Lodge in another jurisdiction on any of the above mentioned transactions, they will be delayed until such time as the proper Masonic protocol is established.

However, a member of a Lodge of a sister jurisdiction, even though he may now reside within the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, is at liberty to corresponds directly with his Lodge.

So, please remember to observe proper Masonic protocol in dealing with all official out-of-state transactions and/or correspondence.

Updates on the Upcoming Unity Class

The York Rite-Shrine Unity Class scheduled for July 18 is rapidly acquiring candidates and we believe we will be witness to an outstanding production and a very large class.



This is probably a good place to say that should any of the York Rite Organizations located in other towns wish to host such an event in the future, I'm sure we can find leaders in Louisville who will be happy to assist in those locations. We must be all about helping one another.

We have been aware for some time that a few of the Chapters, Councils and Commanderies are struggling in their attempts to provide casts at home for their interested Master Masons. We have also been told about Master Masons who want to apply to the York Rite for membership, but can't seem to find a way to join. We believe that this event can aid in several ways to resolve this problem.

The initiation fee that we selected for the event was not to offer "bargain" membership, but to attract attention to what we're doing. The cost of the day is not yet determined, but we believe that we have everything covered for the York Rite expenses, except our advance advertising. We have worked



with the Masonic Home Journal and have managed to keep those costs extremely low, for the coverage we've received. We want as much of the \$100 fee as possible to go to the units accept-

ing the new members. The Scottish Rite is providing the site and lunch as a donation to the effort and to signify their whole-hearted support. Our solicitation for donations in the past several issues of the MHJ have netted several hundred dollars from individuals as well as York Rite organizations. The unsupported cost may be as much as \$4,000. If this is the case, and we can sign up the hoped for 200 candidates. that will break down to \$20 per candidate, total cost.

Using this approximation, that will allow all of the units out in the Commonwealth to realize \$80 from each candidate for their own use. This will necessarily be divided among Chapter, Council and Commandery in any manner that those organizations like.

The Louisville York Rite has already made donations to offset the advertising cost and will realize the same return as all others. The planning committee felt that this was a fair way to pay our expenses. We believe that the anticipated results in the quality of the degree work and the fellowship and education provided that day will more than recompense us.

Our Grand Officers, H. M. Forrester, GM; Jeff Ritchie, GHP, Burton E. Allen, IGM, and Raleigh Foster, Grand Commander should also be able to answer questions about the day as they travel the Commonwealth. 

Grand Lodge Helps Celebrate 200th Anniversary Vincennes Lodge 1 in Indiana

On March 13, 1809, Jonathon Taylor and six other Freemasons gathered in the city of Vincennes in the Indiana Territory and under the dispensation of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky opened Vincennes Lodge. Thus began Freemasonry in what was to become the state of Indiana, as well as the five states into which the Indiana Territory would be carved. On March 13, 2009, Masons from across the country gathered together again in Vincennes to celebrate the bicentennial of Vincennes Lodge No. 1, F & A.M.

With the creation of the state of Indiana in 1816, representatives from the six Lodges within the state met the following year in Corydon to begin negotiations to form their own Grand Lodge. This was accomplished on January 13, 1818, at the Schofield House in Madison. And at that point,
