

Landmark Lodge No. 41 Ray Tucker Memorial Hospice Golf Tournament



"We've got to change". "Masonry has to change". "We're stuck in the past". "The older members of the lodge resist any change at all". No doubt we have all heard these remarks regarding Freemasonry at one time or another. What we may fail to realize is that we have changed over time, slowly perhaps - but changed nevertheless. Certainly, the principles and tenets of the Craft have not changed because they are unchangeable: however our modern day approach to the Fraternity, and the way we practice our Craft, has slowly changed from the way we approached and practiced it a century or so ago. Today we do not meet by a moon schedule, though a few lodges still do so. We no longer travel to lodge by horseback, though we do arrive via horsepower. We no longer struggle to see by moonlight, candle power, or gaslight - but by a constant light source, measured by candlepower (expressed in lumens) supplied by electric current. We no longer have to experience the uneven heat of a coal or wood burning stove to break the chill of the cold of winter, or the opening of vents and windows to get relief from the summer heat - but have the option of central heating and cooling technology to provide us with a comfortable environment during our lodge Communications.

So, considering the above facts, it becomes quite obvious that the Fraternity has succumbed ever so slowly to change over time. The fact it does change is a natural phenomenon since the world, and nature, does not exist in a static state - but in a dynamic one. One of the basic laws of dynamics (kinetics) is that an object in motion tends to remain in motion until influenced by some outside force. So it is with our Fraternity. The principles of Freemasonry remain in constant motion, the same as they were in the beginning; however, our approach to the practice of the Craft has been influenced by the slow moving change of society and expansion of technology. So it becomes quite obvious, considering all the advantages available to us in these modern times, that all change is not a thing to fear, and that Freemasonry has done a reasonable job of meeting the challenges of changes in our society, while holding steadfast to the unchangeable tenets of the Fraternity.

Therefore, it appears, to me at least, that it's not change in its self that draws resistance from the membership - but it's the pace and rate of drastic "change" over a short period of time. Slow change appears to come from thorough and deliberate consideration of the need for a change, one seen as necessary to address a situation, or situations, that is perceived to be a problem for the Fraternity. Many times a drastic, or quick, change seems to be directed more to the symptoms of a personal or particular problem instead addressing the root cause of the problem, and is done in such haste as to not consider what ramifications the changes may have in the Fraternity as a whole. The old saying: "Act in haste, repent in leisure" comes to mind.

So, I think it's most important that we recognize and keep mind the distinction between those changes that occur quite naturally in the Frater-

nity, and those that are sometimes suggested, in many cases, to address one personal or particular issue only. To do otherwise may not demonstrate the best example of good stewardship. And good stewardship is the responsible of each of us.

NOTICE

Section 217 of the <u>Book of Constitutions</u> requires that all motions on resolutions pertaining to amendments of the Constitutions or Laws of the Grand Lodge shall be submitted in writing and presented to the Office of the Grand Secretary no later than August 15, prior to the Annual Communications.

NOTICE

Section 12 (3) of the <u>Book of Constitutions</u> requires that an Elective Representative be a Permanent Member chosen by ballot from the members of his lodge, to represent it in case its Master, Wardens or Secretary cannot attend the communication of the Grand Lodge, and such representative shall be given a certificate of his election over the lodge seal.

WAIVER OF JURISDICTION-FEES RETURNED

From time to time inquiries are made to the Grand Lodge Office concerning the return of fees when a waiver of jurisdiction is granted by a Lodge which has a higher initiation fee than the Lodge making the request for the waiver..

Section 98(a) of the Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F&AM deals specifically to this matter and states:

"In all cases where the fee of the Lodge granting the waiver of jurisdiction is greater than the fee of the Lodge requesting the waiver the candidate shall pay to the Lodge which asks the waiver a fee equivalent to the fee he would have been required to pay had he petitioned the Lodge which granted the waiver. Immediately after the candidate is elected and initiated, the Secretary of the Lodge receiving the waiver shall send the difference in fees to the Lodge granting the waiver."

Simply put, when a Lodge receives a waiver of jurisdiction in favor of a candidate from a Lodge having jurisdiction, where the initiation fee of the Lodge granting jurisdiction is higher than the initiation fee of the Lodge that is requesting the waiver, the candidate pays the higher fee and the difference in the fees must be paid to the Lodge granting the waiver.

ANNUAL RETURNS

At the end of May or in early June you should receive a packet from the Grand Lodge Office containing:

- A form asking for information on members you may have in the Masonic Homes of Kentucky.
- A form certifying the representative of your lodge at our Grand Communication in October

- (in case the Master or one of the line Officers can not attend).
- A post card for you to complete and return to this office.
- Instruction sheet for checking Annual Returns.

I urge you to take care of this quickly, to assure adequate time to review and record the results before Grand Lodge.

Also, sometime in the latter part of July, you will receive a computer printout of your membership and the lodge's Annual Return. Please check this information very carefully for accuracy and return the Annual Return to the Grand Lodge as quickly as possible. It is not necessary to send the Annual Return and payment for the assessments to Grand Lodge at the same time. As soon as the Annual Return is received (after you have checked and corrected it, if necessary) we can then assemble the information in ample time to have it available to the membership at Grand Lodge. You may forward your check for assessments prior to September 1, deadline. It is very important the June Monthly Activity Report be received in the Grand Lodge Office as soon as practical after the end of the month-before the tenth of July deadline, if possible.

I know I can depend on the continued cooperation of the dedicated lodge secretaries of this Grand Jurisdiction to do their best to preserve and maintain a complete and accurate record of their lodge activities.

NOTICE OF REJECTION

Just a reminder to each lodge secretary to report to the Grand Lodge Office, either electronically for those Secretaries who report electronically or on the proper paper form, any petitioner for the degrees who has been rejected by your lodge. I am not sure all lodge secretaries are aware they should report this activity. However, this information could be valuable to another lodge, should the one rejected attempt to petition another lodge at a later date.

In case you do not have any of the Notice of Rejection Forms, you may order them from the Office of the Grand Secretary.

Official Out-Of-State Correspondence

Just a reminder, all official correspondence between Grand Jurisdictions must be transmitted through the Grand Lodge Office. This includes all request for demits, reinstatements, transfers, affiliation, waivers etc. Consequently, if you correspond directly with a Lodge in another jurisdiction on any of the above mentioned transactions, they will be delayed until such time as the proper Masonic protocol is established.

However, a member of a Lodge of a sister jurisdiction, even though he may now reside within the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, is at liberty to corresponds directly with his Lodge.

So, please remember to observe proper Masonic protocol in dealing with all official out-of-state transactions and/or correspondence.

Spring Cleaning — Outside

The inside of the house is not the only place that could use some attention. As the warmer months get closer you will also want to get things ready outdoors so that you have can enjoy your time outside.

Begin by checking your grill. With the pleasant months of spring, you will want to be able to cook and eat outside. Make sure the gas connection is safe. To do this put some soapy water onto the connection, if bubbles form you know there is a leak. You will want to seal this completely. Next use a wire brush to clean the grill. After it is clean spray on some non-stick cooking spray for easier cleaning after the next barb-q. After your grill is all clean sweep your deck or porch. If there is a lot of dirt build up you may want to use your hose to remove the dirt.

Next focus on windows, doors and screens. Remove all screens and lay them on the driveway. Spray them with water from the hose and use an all purpose cleaner to get rid of whatever is left. Allow them to dry as you clean the windows and windowsills.

You will also want to clean outdoor furniture. Plastic furniture can be cleaned with a mixture of water and dishwashing detergent, then rinsed off. This should bring back the original color and remove any dirt. To clean wicker furniture you will want to use a soft brush with water and Murphy Oil Soap. Rinse it off with water and let it air dry. If you have outdoor cushions for your furniture that are looking a little dirty. Use a spray bottle filled with water and one tablespoon of laundry detergent. Spray the solution on the dirty areas and wipe with a soft cloth. Let cushions dry completely.

Check all trees and shrubs and prune them if needed. Replace the soil in window boxes. Fertilize your lawn. The best times of year to fertilize your lawn are early spring and in the fall, so add it to your spring cleaning list so

you don't forget.

If the exterior of your house is looking dirty, you may want to consider a pressure washer. It can be used to clean the dirt off of siding, wood and metal. It also works well for cleaning driveways, sidewalks, porches and decks.

If you use window air conditioners to stay cool during the summer, clean them out and reinstall them.



Louisville Council No. 4 Super Excellent Master Degree

There have been many more initiated in other areas of Kentucky.

The degree is divided into four parts and four distinguished ritualists have agreed to take charge of the four sections. Companion Raleigh Foster will assemble the cast for the opening and closing portions of the degree. Companion Leslie E. Black will do the same for the second section, Companion J. William Riggs will oversee the third section and Companion James C. Reichert will assemble the cast for the fourth section. We anticipate a large turnout and hope that every York Rite member in Kentucky will attend, either as a cast member, a candidate, or a spectator.
