




Ham Henderson – District 11 BBO Fundraiser

Sproutlings begins growing on Louisville campus

With a ceremonial groundbreaking, Sproutlings Pediatric Day Care Center began growing on Masonic Homes' Frankfort Avenue campus. Slated to open in fall 2011, Sproutlings will reside in the

\$4.5 million Kosair Charities Center now under construction.

Sproutlings will offer care for 110 children ages six weeks through early teens, half of whom will be prescribed care by their physicians, along with 55 children without special needs. Masonic Homes was awarded a Certificate of Need from Kentucky's Cabinet for Families and Children to serve medically fragile children in the seven-county KIPDA area development district. The U.S. Department of

Health and Human Services estimates nearly 20 percent of Kentucky children are affected by medical conditions that require daily nursing support and additional therapies.

Sproutlings will be staffed by approximately 50 people working two shifts to operate the center Monday through Saturday from 6 a.m. to midnight. RNs, LPNs and CNAs, as well as childcare education, transportation and administrative professionals, will provide an array of appropriate services and programming. The center will provide 13,900 square feet of dedicated space plus an additional 6,000 square feet of space outdoors in a covered arcade area.

Situated south of existing Masonic Home Village apartments, Sproutlings Day Care Center will occupy the entire first floor of the Kosair Charities Center. Kosair Charities committed \$1 million toward the \$4.5 million construction cost of the project.




