FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

At this writing (early January, another Holiday Season has passed and left us with its "down side" credit card payments, returning of undersized/oversized gifts, bathroom scales indicating an overindulgence of holiday repasts and, probably, some already broken New Years Resolutions. But, after those emotions begins to ebb, we start to relish all the pleasant memories that we shared with our families and friends during this annual Season of caring, sharing and giving. Also, this would be an appropriate time to pause and give thanks to our Creator for all his goodness and loving kindness to all

At this time of the year it's all too easy to feel gloomy because of the short days, sparse sunshine, bone-chilling weather, bare trees, and the lack of green grass, and lovely flowers; and the prospect of another month or so ahead before we begin to see the situation improve. But improve it will, and Spring will come with all its freshness, and promise of beauty. As we enjoy the beauties of Spring, when it does arrive, it would be thoughtful to give a measure of "thanks" to the gloomy Season just past for giving us thankful hearts and a stronger appreciation for the welcome change of the Season.

Lodge Officers Reporting Form The Book of Constitutions requires each subordinate lodge Secretary (Section 92 (7)) to report to the office of the Grand Secretary the names of the officers selected and/or appointed, along with the other information requested, prior to January 10th. The other information requested is the addresses and phone numbers of the principal officers of the lodge, location and directions to the lodge hall, and the financial information required by the IRS.

This report must be received timely in order for the office staff to prepare the report which must be submitted to the IRS in March of each year. If your lodge is not included in the report submitted from the Grand Lodge Office, you may be contacted by the IRS to submit an individual report for the Lodge.

Another reason to submit the information timely is to allow sufficient time to prepare the Masonic Directory as early as possible in the new year, in order to make it as useful as possible. If, for some reason, your lodge does not have all the stations filled, don't hold up reporting what officers you do have by January 10th; you may report any lodge officers, not filled at the time, at a later date.

Just remember, a Directory that does not have every lodge listed--and with all the information requested listed therein, renders the publication less efficient than it would be otherwise, and denies information to those who use the Di-

rectory to plan visits, and who wish to correspond with other lodges.

GRAND LODGE BLANKET INSURANCE

By this time, each lodge Secretary should have received a Memorandum of Insurance statement from the Grand Lodge Office, showing the type, amount and a general description of the coverage each of the items in the agreement provides. You should file the same and use it as proof of coverage. As you are most aware, insurance is a complicated business to most of us. Consequently, it is well nigh impossible to prepare a general statement for this column which would answer all the questions that may come to mind. However, if you find that you have specific questions concerning what is included in the coverage. and to what extent, you may call, either, this office, or contact;

The one insurance question we most often get in the Grand lodge Office concerns insurance on the lodge building. The blanket insurance carried by the Grand Lodge does not in any way include coverage on a lodge building, either liability or property. If your lodge owns a building, you must carry

additional insurance to protect your membership. Should that be the case, you should contact a local insurance agency to determine the plan to suit the needs of your lodge.





by specially trained personnel assigned exclusively to each house. Each house features a home-style kitchen, living rooms and outdoor areas to enjoy with your family and guests. Specialty houses include:


