For instance, the three great Masonic Tenets of a Mason, Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. They are short words – but mean so much when applied to the fullness of the life of a Freemason. Masonic Cornerstone Laying Service Held

A Masonic Cornerstone Laying service was held in Campton, Kentucky on Sunday, June 5th, 2011. The building being dedicated was the new Wolfe County Judicial Center. The service was presided over by our Most Worshipful Grand Master Donald Yankey. Other Grand Lodge Officers who participated in the service included Deputy Grand Master Terry Bowman. Grand Senior Warden Christopher Stout, Grand Junior Warden Rick Nation, Grand Secretary Joe Conway, Grand Chaplain George Ahart, Grand Marshal Billy Michael Taylor, Grand Pursuivant Wilson Wilder, Grand Tiler G. Michael Miller, and District Deputy Grand Master District #24 Scott Lockard.

The four Masonic Lodges that were originally chartered in Wolfe County participated in the service. The Lodges are Cox No. 464, Mizpah No. 507, Torrent No. 711, and Pieratt No. 725. They contributed to the purchase of the cornerstone and the Lodges names were engraved thereon. Representatives of each Lodge was present when Lodge was opened at Cox No. 464. The Significance of Freemasonry by Howard Coop

As Independence Day is observed, as it always is, on July 4, nine men – John Hancock, Benjamin Franklin, Joseph Hewes, William Ellery, William Hooper, Robert Treat Paine Jr., Richard Stockton, George Walton, and William Whipple – should be remembered.

Those nine men were part of the group of founding fathers who prepared and signed the Declaration of Independence. That document, sometimes called "the finest expression of the American ideal ever for*mulated*" and often referred to as "the best known and the noblest of American State papers" irrevocably broke colonial allegiance to Great Britain and became the cornerstone of a new and great nation. By signing that document, those men knew that they were risking their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor. Nevertheless, they acted, believing that what they were doing was right.

Those nine men were Masons. John Hancock, chairman of the group that prepared and signed the Declaration, was a member of Merchants Lodge #277 in Quebec and St. Andrew's Lodge in Boston. Benjamin Franklin was a member of St. John's Lodge #115 in Philadelphia, Pa. The Lodge of which Joseph Hewes was a member is not known, but it is recorded that he was a visitor to Unanimity Lodge #7 in Edenton, N. C. William Ellery was a member of St. John's Lodge in Boston, Mass. and St. Johns Lodge # 4 in Hartford, Conn. William Hooper was a member of Hanover Lodge in Masonboro, N. C. The Lodge of which Robert Treat Paine, Jr. was a member is unknown, but it is recorded that he was present in the Grant Lodge of Massachusetts at Roxbury on June 26, 1796. Richard Stockton was a Charter Member and Master of St. John's Lodge in Princeton, N. J. George Walton was a member of Solomon's Lodge #1 in Savannah, Georgia. William Whipple was a member of St. John's Lodge #1 in Portsmouth. N. H.

Those Masons, along with that which they did, bear witness to the significant contribution of Freemasonry in a crucial period of American history and the good Freemasonry can accomplish at any time when Masons, facing difficult situations, do that which they know to be right.

4th of July History & Trivia – Did You Know...

★ The major objection to being ruled by Britain was taxation without repr sentation. The colonists had no say in the decisions of English Parliament.

★ In May, 1776, after nearly a year of trying to resolve their differences with England, the colonies sent delegates to the Second Continental Congress. Finally, in June, admitting that their efforts were hopeless; a committee was formed to compose the formal Declaration of Independence. Headed by Thomas Jefferson, the committee also included John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Philip Livingston and Roger Sherman. On June 28, 1776, Thomas Jefferson presented the first draft of the declaration to Congress.

 $\bigstar\,$ Betsy Ross, according to legend, sewed the first American flag in May or June 1776, as commissioned by the Congressional Committee.

★ Independence Day was first celebrated in Philadelphia on July 8, 1776.

★ The Liberty Bell sounded from the tower of Independence Hall on July 8, 1776, summoning citizens to gather for the first public reading of the Declaration of Independence by Colonel John Nixon.

★ June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress, looking to promote national pride and unity, adopted the national flag. "Resolved: that the flag of the United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

 \star The word 'patriotism' comes from the Latin patria, which means 'homeland' or 'fatherland.'

 \star The first public Fourth of July event at the White House occurred in 1804.

★ The first Independence Day celebration west of the Mississippi occurred at Independence Creek and was celebrated by Lewis and Clark in 1805.

★ On June 24, 1826, Thomas Jefferson sent a letter to Roger C. Weightman, declining an invitation to come to Washington, D.C., to help celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. It was the last letter that Jefferson, who was gravely ill, ever wrote.

 \star Both Thomas Jefferson and John Adams died on Independence Day, July 4, 1826.

★ The 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence did not sign at the same time, nor did they sign on July 4, 1776. The official event occurred on August 2, 1776, when 50 men signed it.

 \star The names of the signers of the Declaration of Independence were withheld from the public for more than six months to protect the signers. If independence had not been achieved, the treasonable act of the signers would have, by law, resulted in their deaths.

★ Thomas McKean was the last to sign in January, 1777.

 \star The origin of Uncle Sam probably began in 1812, when Samuel Wilson was a meat packer who provided meat to the US Army. The meat shipments were stamped with the initials, U.S. Someone joked that the initials

stood for "Uncle Sam". This joke eventually led to the idea of Uncle Sam symbolizing the United States government.

★ In 1941, Congress declared 4th of July a federal legal holiday. It is one of the few federal holidays that have not been moved to the nearest Friday or Monday.
