Notes FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY JOSEPH R. CONWAY, P.G.M., Grand Secretary

To a young teenager, life is an idyllic adventure, full of mystery, hope, and great expectations for the future. As we get older and deal with our place in the world, gaining life's experience as we go, we kind of fall into a comfortable daily routine with our lives, going along from day to day. A routine which over time becomes automatic and which we often take for granted; that is until something comes along to disturb our complacency and place us in unexpected or unfamiliar territory. This particular time of the year offers the potential for drastic weather changes (violent thunderstorms, tornadoes, strong winds, etc.) which may temporarily disrupt utility services, particularly electrical service, especially vulnerable to heavy winds. We get so accustomed to just flipping the electrical switch and everything is fine. The TV is on, the air-conditioner is performing the function for which it was designed, and the darkness is flooded with light. But when you are forced to sit in the dark, lit only by candle power for hours, and sometimes days, and have to drastically change your routine for a few days, you gain a deeper appreciation for those things we normally take for granted.

I think we may have allowed the same complacency to creep into our attitudes and commitments towards our lodges and Freemasonry. The close parallel between the two topics appeared to be quite obvious. After all, many of the things we are still doing in the Fraternity are the same things we have been doing for years and appear to have served Freemasonry so well. Consequently, we fall into a comfortable routine with where we are and what we are doing, and unconsciously begin to look inward, dwelling on past accomplishments; an understandable human trait!

We Masons sometimes need a good unexpected jolt to shake us out of our lethargic state and force us to deal with conditions as they really are, not necessarily what we desire them to be. Now I would be the last one to suggest that we make any changes in our philosophy, tenets and/or landmarks of the Fraternity, for those are what make us true Masons. However, with modern technology in the communication field, interstate roads, computers and e-mail, etc. we may need a jolt of some sort to reenergize our lodges, and especially our lodge members, to make our presence in our local communities more obvious and relative. Our declining numbers may well be the unrecognized jolt we need to bring us out of our comfort zone and force us to assess just how relative we are in our communities. If we are not growing, that seems to be a clear indication that we may have lost touch with our local communities.

What to do about it? There is no magic all-encompassing solution that will work for each and every lodge in Kentucky. Each lodge will have to find a solution tailor-made for the community in which it is located. The first step is to look beyond what we are presently doing and find new ways to let the non-Masons in our communities know that Freemasons are relative, that they are members of and interested in the welfare of their community, and that we are here to stay.

In dealing with a power outage problem the matter may simply be solved by a trip to Home Depot to purchase a generator. I think this is what we may need at this time to restore our Gentle Fraternity to its formal standing in society in general, and our communities in particular—a generator—remembering that each one of us is a generator of sorts, and what our Fraternity is now, and what it is to become, depends proportionally on just how much enthusiasm, dedication, and commitment we display in our personal lives for the principles and tenets of Freemasonry in our communities and to the non-Masonic public.

So, let's keep the generator running 24/7 and watch Freemasonry blossom anew!

I don't know if any of the individuals involved in the following article I lifted from Reader's Digest were Masons or not – but I would like to think so. Nevertheless, it demonstrates a powerful lesson in integrity.

Pulling into my service station 45 minutes late one morning, I shouted to the customers, "Tll turn the pumps on right away!" What I didn't know was that the night crew had left them on all night. By the time I got to the office, most of the cars had filled up and driven off. Only one customer stayed to pay. My heart sank. Then the customer pulled a wad of cash from his pocket and handed it to me. "We kept passing the money to the last guy," he said. "We figured you'd show up sooner or later."

# The Declaration of INDEPENDANCE

The Declaration of Independence was signed by 56 men representing the 13 colonies. The moment marked the beginning of all-out war against the British. The American Revolutionary War is said to have started in 1775, however. The Declaration was signed more than two years after Boston officials refused to return three shiploads of taxed tea to Britain, fueling colonists to dump the tea into the harbor in what became the infamous Boston Tea Party.

The Declaration of Independence itself has become one of the most admired and copied political documents of all time. It was written by Thomas Jefferson and revised by John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, and Jefferson.

The Declaration of Independence is a justification of the American Revolution, citing grievances against King George III. It is also a landmark philosophical statement, drawing on the writings of philosophers John Locke and Jean Jacques Rousseau. It affirms that since all people are creatures of God, or nature, they have certain natural rights, or liberties, that cannot be violated.

The Declaration and the American Revolution have since inspired freedom-seekers the around the world.

Several countries used the Declaration of Independence as a beacon in their own struggles for freedom. Among them, France. Then later, Greece, Poland, Russia and many countries in South America.


### The Influence of Good Fathers by Howard Coop

It was, indeed, a pleasant visit at the end of a long and busy day. The father, the mother, and their little son welcomed us graciously into their home. As we visited, the little boy, active and playful, was expressive and interacted with us in a pleasant way that made the visit most enjoyable.

At once, some things were obvious; it was noticeable in several significant ways that the life of the father was having a decidedly shaping influence upon the life of that little boy. Beyond his physical appearance that was the

result of gene transmission, the influence of his father was obvious in the son's attitude, imitative habits of speech, and behavior. In so many ways, the little fellow talked and acted like his father. To put it in vernacular terms, some would say that the little boy was"the spittin' image" of his father.

Fathers are many things to their children. They are examples, mentors, teachers, disciplinarians, guidance counselors, and role models for them. Therefore, as fathers live with their children from day to day in the home and interact with them on a regular basis, they are one of the more important life shaping

> Washington, is a time to pay tribute to good fathers and recognize the important role they have in the development of their sons and daughters and, through that role, the contribution they make to a stable society.



### **DISTRICT 15 VISITS WEST LIBERTY**

The entire city of West Liberty suffered extensive destruction from tornados and storms earlier in 2012, including the destruction of Highland Lodge #311. The purpose of this visit was to present the Brothers of Highland Lodge with the proceeds of a districtwide fundraising effort, coordi-
