Grand Master's Message



RICHARD T. NATION Grand Master

I want to tell you a story about a little country Lodge that experienced great growth in the early 80's when most Lodges were losing members right and left. They were taking in policemen, firefighters, EMS personnel, farmers, factory workers, government workers, and businessmen. They were growing by leaps and bounds. Unfortunately, it had been years and years since much had been going on. A handful of older Brothers had kept the fires burning. They did remember how to confer the Degrees and did so in a very creditable manner, even though some were on oxygen, some could not stand to confer an entire lecture, and some had to use note cards because their memory had started slipping a bit. A small group of the newer Brothers got together and said there is no sense in making these elderly

Brothers do all the work. We are younger, reasonably intelligent, willing and able to do this for them. "But, what will these distinguished older Brothers say about it. Will they resent us trying to take over?" "Let's ask them." The older Brothers replied, "Thank God you've come. We've been laboring in the quarries for decades. We are tired. We are broken down. We welcome you taking some of the burden from us. But, know this, we will still be here to support you, to help you in any way we can." And they did.

One by one, those older Brothers joined that innumerable caravan which moved to the pale realms of shade, where each took his chamber in the silent halls of death. But they left behind a legacy. They left behind what quickly became, arguably, the best Lodge in the state. That Lodge became the Lodge that was held up as a shining example of what a Lodge should be. Visiting Brothers came from all parts of the state to try to learn what their secret was. It was no secret. It was a group of very good friends and upstanding Masons united in a single vision. A vision that their Lodge would be second to none. And, my goodness, how they succeeded.

Let's fast forward a couple of decades. Some of those energetic young Masons have joined the older Brothers in the Celestial Lodge. Some have retired and moved to sunnier climes. Some have become more involved in the

Eastern Star, or Grand Lodge. Some have just gotten old and no longer have the desire or ability to work as hard as they did in years past. But the Lodge has younger members coming in. New Masons who want to do the work. Younger Brothers who have new ideas they want to try. You would think the older Brothers, who had been doing so much of the work, who had been laboring for so long, would welcome the relief. Just as their pleas to help had been welcomed so many years ago. But, alas, these older Brothers have come to resent the younger Brothers trying to change anything. We've all heard the classic response, "That's not how we did it when I was Master!" "We tried that 30 years ago, it didn't work then and it won't work now." They have created a rift within the Lodge they worked so hard to build. Instead of all the Brothers being united in a common vision, each is trying to preserve his own little kingdom. The one who has been in office for decades. The one who has conferred the Stair Lecture for years. The one who does their installations. Nobody wants to step aside and let the younger Brothers take over. Because, they will do it differently. Probably just as good, maybe even better. Brothers, we need to unite to destroy this kind of attitude in our Lodges. It is holding us back. It is preventing us from being all we could and should be.

York Rite, Scottish Rite, Shrine,

Brothers, the District Deputies have been or will be visiting your Lodges. Instead of just wearing a fancy apron, I have asked my Deputies to be my personal representative. I have charged them to fulfill their duties as defined by the Constitution and I quote "The District Deputy Grand Master shall inspect the halls, books, methods and work of particular Lodges and make reports to the Grand Master as he shall direct." Be advised, my Deputies should be looking at a lot more than those in the past have done. If you have a problem with it, blame me, not them.

Brothers, December is the month designated by our Constitution for each Lodge to elect their Officers. I hope you will give praverful consideration to who is the best man for the job. It may not be the one in the preceding chair. It may be the Brother who sits patiently on the sidelines but is so full of talents and energy that he glows. It's up to each of you to decide that for yourself. Please, Brothers, put your personal feelings aside and consider what is best for your Lodge and this Fraternity.

Karen and I, and the rest of our family, wish you and yours the Merriest of Christmases. May you enjoy a Happy, Prosperous, and Healthy New Year.

I love you, my Brothers. May God bless you, may God bless the United States and her military forces, and may God bless this great Fraternity.

The following EDICT issued by the Grand Master, Most Worshipful Brother Richard T. Nation, is being published here in compliance with Section 33 (5) of the Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F.&A.M.:

EDICT RICHARD T. NATION GRAND MASTER OCTOBER 22, 2013

Whereas, I feel strongly that charging dues to Entered Apprentices and Fellow Craft Masons without allowing them a voice in how the funds are spent is inherently wrong; and

Whereas, I feel it reprehensible to take their money and give them no say in how it is spent; and

Whereas, to continue to do so appears to reach the level of taxation without representation,

Therefore, in an effort to allow Lodges to return to the traditional way of doing things, I am issuing this Edict, as of the date noted above, allowing Lodges to conduct routine business in the Entered Apprentice Degree. Only Master Masons are allowed to vote, hold office or serve on committees. Any Lodge wishing to conduct business in the Entered Apprentice Degree must notify the Grand Master and Grand Secretary in writing, as well as the Lodge membership. The notice to the Lodge membership must be in conformance with Section 108 of the Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F. & A. M. This edict is to be read aloud to the membership by the Master at the next Stated Communication following its reception and entered upon the minutes.

The Homes also recognized the service of Brother Kerry Sluss (Greenup No. 89 and Warfield No. 882) whose term as a director ended.

Sharing knows no bounds



Lodges in Districts 1, 2 and 3 collected enough food and money to help feed more than 40 families in Shelby County.

Homes' District 3 Ambassador Bill Perry (Clinton No. 82) noticed a story in the October issue of *Masonic Home Journal* about Masonic Home of Shelbyville's effort to provide Thanksgiving meals to Shelby County families in need. Perry emailed Western Kentucky area lodges and suggested they could all pitch in to help. He encouraged lodges he visited to dig deep to assist.

By the time the 214th Annual Communication convened, lodges in three districts had amassed \$1,100 in cash and food. Perry, along with representatives of many of the lodges who had given, presented a hotel cart full of groceries and a check to help Masonic Home of Shelbyville exceed its goal. The Homes General Manager for Hospitality Services Linda Wagner was overwhelmed. "Our goal was to collect enough to provide Thanksgiving meals to 25 families," Wagner said. "The outpouring of generosity from Western Kentucky will help us serve at least twice as many families."

Masonic Home of Shelbyville partnered with Clay Village Baptist Church in Shelby County on the project. Masonic Home food vendor Sysco is providing a turkey for each family.

"Good food is a big part of the Thanksgiving holiday," Wagner said. "We are thrilled to share this blessing to those in Shelby County who really need it."
