ANNUAL COMMUNICATION PAMPHLET

The 214th Annual Communication pamphlet that contains instructions for the Lodge delegates who will attend the Annual Communication will be mailed to each Lodge Secretary on or soon after September 1. The pamphlet also lists all legislation that is to come before the assembly, along with the budget that is proposed for the next Grand Lodge fiscal year. Other budget information provided in the pamphlet is a projection of revenue that will be realized from the craft, based on the membership, and from other sources.

These pamphlets will also be available to each member that registers at the Annual Communication for as long as they last.

Each Lodge Secretary is instructed to read the pamphlet at the next communication of the Lodge following receipt of the same, and pass it on to the delegate that will represent the Lodge at the Annual Communication. This will insure that the delegates will come to Grand Lodge fully prepared to consider, discuss, and to act upon the issues at hand. However, should the delegate fail to receive one from the Secretary of his Lodge, one will be found in his registration packet when he registers at the annual session.

Every attempt is being made to ensure that each delegate is fully informed on the issues of legislation and budget prior to the Annual Communication. However, if some questions still remain, perhaps a call to the Grand Lodge Office or to one of the Grand Lodge Officers about your concerns might be helpful.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

A reminder to all Grand Lodge Committee Chairmen who wish to have their reports printed in the Advance Proceedings, they must be received in the Grand Lodge Office prior to September 15th. This deadline allows only enough time to assemble the Reports and complete the printing of the *Advance Proceedings* prior to the Annual Communication.

However, if you have your report finished earlier than the 15th of September, please send it on to the Grand Lodge Office at your earliest convenience. The office staff and I will certainly appreciate it.

LEGISLATION TO BE PRESENTED AT THE 214th ANNUAL COMMUNICATION OF THE GRAND LODGE OF KENTUCKY, FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS

ITEMS LAID OVER FROM THE 213th ANNUAL COMMUNICATION TO BE ACTED UPON

ITEM NO. 1

Amend Section 96.

Springfield Lodge No. 50, F&AM, Magnolia Lodge No. 201, F&AM, J. Speed Smith Lodge No. 298, F&AM, and Emulation Lodge No. 688, F&AM, respectfully request to have concurrent jurisdiction in Washington County, Kentucky.

Legislation to be Presented at the 214th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, Free and Accepted Masons

ITEM 1

Section 20 now reads.

Vote - Who May. Each elected Grand Lodge Officer, Past Grand Master and the representative from each subordinate Lodge shall have one vote and no more; Past Masters shall have one vote collectively no one shall vote by proxy.

Shall be amended to read.

Section 20 Vote - Who may. Each elective Grand Lodge Officer, Past Grand Master, The Top 3 Officers (Master, Senior Warden, Junior Warden) from each subordinate Lodge or the elected representative of each Lodge shall have one vote each and no more; Past Masters shall have one vote collectively and no one shall vote by proxy.

ITEM 2 Section 134 - Objection.

- (A) An objection to initiation, advancement or affiliation may be made by a member of the lodge, and the objection to initiation or affiliation shall have precisely the same effect, in every respect, as if the objector had cast an unfavorable ballot on the petition. An objection, to be valid, must be made before the preparation of the candidate in the case of initiation or advancement and before the ballot is taken in the case of affiliation. "Before the preparation of the candidate" shall be defined as before the candidate is conducted to the preparation room.
- (B) Objection to advancement shall prevent the candidate from receiving the degree for six months from the date the

the minutes: and after the expiration of six months the candidate may be advanced upon request without formal petition, but notice shall be given of the proposed advancement in open lodge.

- (C) Objection may be renewed, or other objection made in like manner and with the same effect within one week before the end of the six-month period or any succeeding six month period.
- (D) Such objection may be made in open lodge or to the Master privately and if made at a stated communication the objection shall be noted in the minutes without giving the name of the objector; and if not made or reported at a stated communication, then in every case the objection must be noted in the minutes of the next stated communication as above
- (E) The objecting brother shall not be questioned as to his reasons, but he may give them if he chooses, and if he voluntarily states his reasons in open lodge, or privately to the Master who shall preserve the identity of the Brother making the objection and shall not reveal his identity to anyone, the lodge shall pass upon the sufficiency and validity of the objection, and a majority vote by ballot shall be necessary to sustain the objection. If not sustained the lodge shall proceed with the advancement of the candidate.
- (F) Any objection to advancement may be withdrawn by the objector in open lodge, or to the Master privately and the withdrawal must be noted in the minutes at a stated communication and the candidate may then be advanced.
- (G) Unless charges are preferred, no objection shall prevent an entered Apprentice or Fellow Craft Mason from participating fully in any degree which he has attained, or having a demit issued to him as provided in Section 149.

McNeil Lodge No. 586 wishes to submit the following changes for the 214th ses-

Where as a Brother should have the right to know why he is not being advanced, and Where as the Lodge should have the right to decide on all actions of the Lodge. Be it resolved That Section 134 (C, D, E, & F) be changed to read.

(A) An objection to initiation, advancement or affiliation may be made by a member of the lodge, and the objection to initiation or affiliation shall have precisely the same effect, in every respect, as if the objector had cast an unfavorable ballot on the petition. An objection, to be valid, must be made before the preparation of the candidate in the case of initia-

objective is, or should have been noted in tion or advancement and before the ballot is taken in the case of affiliation. "Before the preparation of the candidate' shall be defined as before the candidate is conducted to the preparation room.

- (B) Objection to advancement shall prevent the candidate from receiving the degree for six months from the date the objective is, or should have been noted in the minutes: and after the expiration of six months the candidate may be advanced upon request without formal petition, but notice shall be given of the proposed advancement in open lodge.
- (C) Objection may be renewed, at this time the objecting brother must state his objection, or Masonic charges must be filed on the Candidate within 30 days.
- (D) Such objection may be made in open lodge or to the Master privately in person and if made at a stated communication the objection shall be noted in the minutes without giving the name of the objector; and if not made or reported at a stated communication, then in every case the objection must be noted in the minutes of the next stated communication as above provided.
- (E) The objecting brother shall not be questioned but by the Master privately. The Master shall preserve the identity of the Brother making the objection and shall not reveal his identity to anyone, the lodge shall pass upon the sufficiency and validity of the objection, and a majority vote by ballot shall be necessary to sustain the objection. If not sustained the lodge shall proceed with the advancement of the candidate.
- (F) Any objection to advancement may be withdrawn by the objector in open lodge, or to the Master privately in person and the withdrawal must be noted in the minutes at a stated communication and the candidate may then be advanced.
- (G) Unless charges are preferred, no objection shall prevent an entered Apprentice or Fellow Craft Mason from participating fully in any degree which he has attained, or having a demit issued to him as provided in Section 149.

Resolution: Camp Knox Lodge No. 919, at a stated Convocation on June 3, 2013, adopted the resolution for Grand Lodge to change the Constitution to add wording to the time between degrees recognizing the heroic contribution and sacrifices our service men make to our freedoms and that due not to their own choosing they are deployed to areas of hazard duty, the following change to Section 142 is proposed.

Section 143 TIME BETWEEN DEGREES

As reads: The time between petition and initiation or affiliation and ballot thereon, and the time between each degree is a minimum of one lunar month. and the Grand Master is not authorized to dispense with this time, except in case or cases where it has been determined an Entered Apprentice and/or Fellow Craft Mason will not survive to be Raised a Master Mason under the aforementioned time constraint, the Grand Master is authorized to make the Entered Apprentice and/or Fellow Craft a Mason at Sight (2009)

Change to read: The time between petition and initiation or affiliation and ballot thereon, and the time between each degree is a minimum of one lunar month, and the Grand Master is not authorized to dispense with this time, except in case or cases where it has been determined an Entered Apprentice and/or Fellow Craft Mason will not survive to be Raised a Master Mason under the aforementioned time constraint, due to health condition or if a Service member being shipped to a Combat Zone, the Grand Master is authorized to make the Entered Apprentice and/or Fellow Craft a Mason at Sight (2009)

ITEM 4 Section 124 PETITIONS—WHEN RECEIVED AND BALLOTED ON.

A petition for initiation or for affiliation shall be recommended by two Master Masons who are members of the lodge petitioned, and be referred to a committee of three other members for inquiry into the character and qualifications of the petitioner. Such petition must be received at a stated communication and one lunar month must intervene between its reception and the balloting thereon. But no ballot shall be taken on a petition until said committee shall have made its report thereon. If, however, the petitioner shall have been rejected by another lodge in this Grand Jurisdiction, a copy of the petition shall be forwarded to the lodge which last rejected him and be referred by it to a committee of three members for inquiry into the character and qualifications of the petitioner, and the report of the committee shall be forwarded under the seal of the lodge to the lodge petitioned and no ballot shall be taken until its receipt of such a report. If said report is not made to the lodge making the request within ninety days, said lodge making the request has full power and authority to proceed to act on the petition and elect or reject the applicant. A ballot must be taken upon a petition for initiation or affiliation, whether the report of the Committee on Investigation be favorable or unfavorable, unless the petition be withdrawn, as permitted in Section 125 of the Constitution. A member whose name appears upon a petition as recommending the petitioner shall not be put upon the Committee on Investigation. The report of a majority of an Investigating Committee is the report of the committee, but if there be a minority report, the fact should be a part of his record. If the committee has taken no action for one or more months after their appointment, the Master may treat their places vacant and appoint others to be the Investigating Committee, A committee to whom a petition for affiliation is referred should take into consideration not only the moral character and fitness of the applicant, but also the authenticity of his demit or current status if for dual membership.

Amended to read: Section 124 PETITIONS—WHEN RECEIVED AND BALLOTED ON.

A petition for initiation or for affiliation shall be recommended by two Master Masons who are members of the lodge petitioned, and be referred to a committee of three other members for inquiry into the character and qualifications of the petitioner. Such petition must be received at a stated communication and one lunar month must intervene between its reception and the balloting thereon. But no ballot shall be taken on a petition until said committee shall have made its report thereon. If. however, the petitioner shall have been rejected by another lodge in this Grand Jurisdiction, a copy of the petition shall be forwarded to the lodge which last rejected him and be referred by it to a committee of three members for inquiry into the character and qualifications of the petitioner, and the report of the committee shall be forwarded under the seal of the lodge to the lodge petitioned and no ballot shall be taken until its receipt of such a report. If said report is not made to the lodge making the request within ninety days, said lodge making the request has full power and authority to proceed to act on the petition and elect or reject the applicant. If a plea of guilty for a felony has ever been entered or a conviction of a felony has been rendered, the petition will be deemed as rejected without ballot and the petition fee will be returned. Otherwise, a ballot must be taken upon a petition for initiation or affiliation, whether the report of the Committee on Investigation be favorable or unfavorable, unless the petition be withdrawn, as permitted in Section 125 of the Constitution. A member whose name appears upon a petition as recommending the petitioner shall not be put upon the Committee on Investigation. The report of a majority of an Investigating Committee is the report of the committee, but if there be a minority report, the fact should be a part of his record. If the committee has taken no action for one or more months after their appointment, the Master may treat their places vacant and appoint others to be the Investigating Committee. A committee to whom a petition for affiliation is referred should take into consideration not only the moral character and fitness of the applicant, but also the authenticity of his demit or current status if for dual membership.

ITEM 5 Section 20 as it now reads: 1) SECTION 20VOTE-WHO MAY VOTE.

Each Elective Grand Officer, Past Grand Master, And The Representative From Each Subordinate Lodge, Shall Have One Vote And No More; Past Masters Shall Have One Vote Collectively. No Lodge Shall Vote By Proxy.

a) PROPOSED CHANGE TO READ: SECTION 20-

VOTE-WHO MAY VOTE.

Each Elective Grand Officer, Past Grand Masters, The Representative From Each Subordinate Lodge, And Each Past Master Of Any Subordinate Lodge Who Is Registered, And Present When A Vote Is Conducted Shall Have An Individual Vote. No One Shall Vote By Proxy.

THE REASONING FOR THE PROPOSED CHANGE:

That since the Book Of Constitutions of The Grand Lodge Of Kentucky is the binding, (LAWS), of all subordinate lodges and its members under this Grand Jurisdiction, it would only seem fair, right, proper, and logical, that the subordinate lodges and its members, (THE CRAFT), should have more representation when voting on issues that will ultimately affect, (BIND), their subordinate lodges, it's members, and all of the members, (THE CRAFT), of this Grand Jurisdiction in general.

ITEM 6 LODGE DUES

SECTION 154. Dues to Fix and Collect. Each lodge shall fix and collect such annual dues as may be necessary to enable it to maintain itself and discharge its duties and obligations, payable before the Entered Apprentice Degree is conferred. The dues of all Lodges shall be due on January 1 each year, and payable in advance for the full year, except as provided by law as to Provisional Demits. Dues for each year shall be delinquent on April 1, and the delinquent members shall be subject to suspension on the stated meeting of the Lodge in June. Any lodge failing to collect dues from a brother, for more than one year, and failing to notify said brother of his delinquency each year, shall forfeit the right to collect more than one years delinquent dues from said member, and on payment of same, said member shall be in good standing with his Lodge.

Amend to read: LODGE DUES

SECTION 154. Dues to Fix and Collect. Each lodge shall fix and collect such annual dues as may be necessary to enable it to maintain itself and discharge its duties and obligations, payable before the Entered Apprentice Degree is conferred. The dues of all Lodges shall be due on January 1 each year, and payable in advance for the full year, except as provided by law as to Provisional Demits. Dues for each year shall be delinquent on January 1, and the delinquent members shall be subject to suspension, on the stated meeting of the Lodge in June. At the discretion of the subordinate Lodge, no earlier than the April stated meeting of the subordinate Lodge. Any lodge failing to collect dues from a brother, for more than one year, and failing to notify said brother of his delinquency each year, shall forfeit the right to collect more than one years delinquent dues from said member, and on payment of same, said member shall be in good standing with his Lodge. Any Brother suspended under this section shall be subject to reinstatement as set out in Section 187 of this Constitution.

This change is submitted to make Section 154 consistent with our current dues structure as indicated on our dues card, which states that the past year's dues have been paid "through December 31, 20xx.

This change also addresses changes made in the reinstatement process in Section 187 as amended at the Kentucky Grand Lodge Communication in 2012 as follows:

SECTION 187-

After Suspension for Non-Payment.

A brother suspended for non-payment of dues shall rest under suspension until he has submitted a petition for reinstatement to the lodge from which he was first suspended, which petition must be referred to and be reported on by committee the same as any other petition for membership, paid the amount owing up to the time of suspension, and re-elected to membership by unanimous ballot of the membership present. (2012).

Meet Charles Elston






