From time to time it behooves us to stop and think about what the Fraternity means to each of us as individual members. I feel certain that every Mason has been asked at one time or another "Just what benefit does one get by membership in the Fraternity"? Even though there are benefits associated with a Masonic membership, we are taught early in our Masonic lectures we are not to use our membership for personal or financial gain. However, what we can expect to experience as a member is a strong feeling of fellowship and camaraderie, and a sense of belonging to a group of like-minded Brethren with which we share a common experience; that of being Raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason. Occasionally, however, we sometimes get so absorbed in our own Lodge and/or Grand Jurisdiction we fail to realize each member of the Fraternity is connected to every other Freemason throughout the universe by virtue of our shared experience, and does not end at the door of our particular Lodge: nor does it end at the boundaries of our respective Grand Jurisdiction. We are further taught in our lectures that Masonic charity is at the very heart of the Masonic Fraternity.

The above noted tenets of the Fraternity have been demonstrated on several occasions when a Kentucky Freemason or a member of his family has encountered a problem while traveling out of state, and even out of the country. On one occasion a Kentucky Mason's daughter and son-in-law was on a vacation trip south when their car broke down in another state. A call from the Grand Lodge Office to the Grand Secretary of that particular state set in motion a process to get the couple a loaner car and arrange to have their car repaired while the couple continued on with their vacation plans. On another


occasion, a newly married couple with Masonic connections was on their honeymoon in a small European country when they were involved in an automobile accident and admitted to a hospital where very little English was spoken. A call to the Grand Secretary of the respective country resulted in a number of visits by doctors who did speak English, as well as other local members of the Fraternity who offered their assistance.

The above mentioned incidents are just a couple of like incidents which occur daily throughout the world, and clearly demonstrates we are truly members of a worldwide Fraternity. So, let's occasionally remind ourselves not to become too absorbed in our own immediate affairs as to become temporarily blinded to the realization that each of us—every Freemason—is a vital link in this worldwide Brotherhood.



### Ten myths of charitable bequests

Much of Masonic Homes of Kentucky's legacy was built through charitable bequests. Still, there are misunderstandings about giving in this way. Here are 10 myths that keep many people from donating through their estate.

- Only wealthy estates can make a bequest.
   Big bequests come from famous people,
   but the greatest number comes from typical people.
- Small bequests won't help.

  Some people "endow" the amount they give during life through a charitable bequest. If they give \$200 a year during life, a bequest of just \$4,000, when invested and earning 5%, keeps giving this amount each year, permanently.
- Bequests are complicated.
   Actually, bequests are simple to add with little impact on the will-making cost. For a sample of the correct language, contact the Homes. When changing your will, we encourage using a qualified attorney.
- It's family or charity.
   Many people make the charitable gift a

residual bequest that provides a percentage of the estate to the charity after family members receive their inheritance.

- You must tell the charity that it is in your will.
   This is not required, but letting the Homes know of your decision allows us to acknowledge your generosity.
- There's no recognition until after death.
   The Homes recognizes bequest donors as members of the Olmsted Society, which includes those who have named the Homes as a beneficiary of their will or other planned gift.
- Charitable bequests are uncommon.
   Bequests are the most popular planned gift, allowing people to leave a legacy that will continue long after their death.
- There are no benefits to the donor for leaving a charitable bequest.
   There can be tax savings for your estate and financial benefits to your heirs that last for years. Plus, you have the satisfaction helping those in need well into the future.
- If you have a will and wish to add a charitable bequest, your will must be rewritten.

Unless you have other changes, a simple

codicil can be added to an existing will.

 Only the wealthy can leave a legacy.
 Everyone who makes a charitable bequest of any amount leaves a legacy that reflects what they valued in life.







Thirty places nationwide with "liberty" in their name. Liberty, Missouri (26,232) boasts the highest population of the 30 at 26,232. Iowa has more of these places than any other state at four: Libertyville, New Liberty, North Liberty and West Liberty.

And what could be more fitting than spending the day in a place called "America"? There are five such places in the country, with the most populous being American Fork, Utah, with 21,941 residents.

Five places adopted the name "freedom." Freedom, California, with 6,000 residents, has the largest population among these.

There is one place named "patriot" Patriot, Indiana, with a population of 202.

Eleven places have "independence" in their name. The most populous of these is Independence, Missouri, with 113,288 residents.
