It is with profound sorrow that I officially announce to you the passing of our beloved Past Grand Master

WILLIAM GORDON HINTON

Brother Hinton entered upon eternal rest Tuesday, April 8, 2014, at his home on the Campus of the Masonic Home of Kentucky in Shelbyville, Kentucky.

Masonic Services were conducted at the Scottish Rite Consistory, 200 E. Gray Street, Louisville, Kentucky on Tuesday, May 13, 2014 at 7:00 PM (EDT) by the Officers and Brethren of Shelby Lodge No. 662, F. & A. M.. MW Brother Richard T. Nation, Grand Master (662) conducted the Masonic Funeral Rites as Acting Master of Shelby Lodge No. 662. Many other Masonic dignitaries and Brethren were present for the Masonic Service. There was also visitation at Hopkinsville Lodge No. 37 on Wednesday, May 14, 2014, 11:00 AM-12 noon (CDT), followed by graveside services and interment at the Glenwood Cemetery, Elkton, Kentucky. All funeral arrangements were entrusted to and under the direction of the Webb

Funeral Home, 1144 W. Main Street, Shelbyville, Kentucky.

Brother Hinton, the son of the late Lawrence Hinton and Nellie Mae Hollingsworth Hinton, was born in Hopkinsville, Kentucky on August 31, 1947. He was educated in the Hopkinsville Public School System, and graduated from Hopkinsville High School with honors in 1965. He received the Bachelor of Music Education Degree from the George Peabody College for Teachers (Nashville, TN-1969); and Master of Arts in Education from Austin Peay State University (Clarksville, TN-1972). He completed additional graduate work at Austin Peay State University; the University of Kentucky and Murray State University.

Brother Hinton served as teacher and choral director at the Hopkinsville High School and Koffman Junior High Schools, and Director of Music and Education at the First United Methodist Church of Hopkinsville. He later joined the staff of the University of Kentucky, Hopkinsville Community College, as Coordinator of Continuing Education, and then, as Dean of Student Affairs/Registrar until his retirement in 1991.

Brother Hinton was a member of Grace Episcopal Church, Hopkinsville, Kentucky, and served as Choirmaster for several intermittent terms.

As we were taught by our Instructors in the lectures of three Degrees of Freemasonry, we became acquainted with many "blanket" or "buzz" words that cover a broad area of a philosophy or description of a lifestyle and/or personal traits that define us as Masons; for instance, the three great Masonic Tenets of a Mason, Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. They are short words - but mean so much when applied to the fullness of the life of a Freemason. The same can be said for the Four Cardinal Virtues, which are Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence, and Justice. Other such words that are freely used in our lectures which come to mind are Honor, Rectitude, Morality, Propriety, Integrity, etc.

Though, the words noted above refer to the positive side of Freemasonry, there are other words that suggest negative connotations, words like Ignorance, Envy, and Superstition; words that describe the unholy conduct of the three misfits who brought shame to the Operative Masons at the building of the Temple. There are many other "blanket" or "buzz" words that can quickly paint a mental image in our minds, and remind us of our duties and obligations as a Mason, the same as the symbols of our Order do, and to guide our conduct as Masons.

However, I think there is another such word that is not usually mentioned and is often overlooked in the lectures of Freemasonry—though maybe not always ignored-which describes a protocol that is most important to Freemasons, and also necessary to make all those words mentioned above meaningful. That word is Discipline! For all that Freemasonry is, it certainly sets guidelines for its members to follow, a discipline to practice self-control, and to exemplify orderly conduct; a discipline that should be the ultimate goal of every Freemason. So, let's make Discipline as much a part of the vocabulary of Freemasonry as all the other "blanket words" with which we are familiar. And let's remember that it's our personal discipline in striving to live by the Tenets of our Fraternity that keeps us within that certain "point within a circle".

WAIVER OF JURISDICTION- FEES RETURNED

There have been several inquiries made to the Grand Lodge Office recently concerning the return of fees when a waiver of jurisdiction is granted by a Lodge which has a higher initiation fee than the Lodge making the request for the waiver of jurisdiction. Section 98(a) of the Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F&AM deals specifically to this matter and states:

"In all cases where the fee of the Lodge granting the waiver of jurisdiction is greater than the fee of the Lodge requesting the waiver the candidate shall pay to the Lodge which asks the waiver a fee equivalent to the fee he would have been required to pay had he petitioned the Lodge which granted the waiver. Immediately after the candidate is elected, and initiated, the Secretary of the Lodge receiving the waiver shall send the difference in fees to the Lodge granting the waiver."

Simply put, when a Lodge receives a waiver of jurisdiction in favor of a candidate from a Lodge having jurisdiction, where the initiation fee of the Lodge granting jurisdiction is higher than the initiation fee of the Lodge that is requesting the waiver, the candidate pays the higher fee and the difference in the fees must be paid to the Lodge granting the waiver.

OFFICIAL OUT-OF-STATE CORRESPONDENCE

Just a reminder, all official correspondence between Grand Jurisdictions must be transmitted through the respective Grand Lodge Offices. This includes all request for demits, reinstatements, transfers, affiliation, waivers etc. Consequently, if you correspond directly with a Lodge in another jurisdiction on any of the above mentioned transactions, they will be delayed until such time as the proper Masonic protocol is established. However, a member

of a Lodge of a sister jurisdiction, even though he may now reside within the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, is at liberty to corresponded directly with his Lodge.

So, please remember to observe proper Masonic protocol in dealing with all official out-of-state transactions and/or correspondence.



Brother Hinton was preceded in death by his mother, Nellie Mae Hollingsworth Hinton and father, Lawrence Hinton. He is survived by his two uncles; James Hinton, Augusta, Georgia and Harold Hinton, Russellville, Kentucky; cousin, Sherry Hinton, Russellville, Kentucky; and a second cousin, Carroll Johnson, Hopkinsville. Most Worshipful Brother William Gordon Hinton was a knowledgeable, active and dedicated Freemason which has been firmly demonstrated in his search for more Masonic knowledge through the many appendant and concordant Masonic bodies with which he was associated throughout his life. The following tribute by Brother Dundee Fulford, Chairman of Committee on Biography (1991-92) to Brother Hinton is found in the 1992 Grand Lodge Proceedings of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky: "The Grand Master is a Masonic scholar. He has traveled extensively and has visited many Masonic lodges in our country and in other countries. He has studied Masonry and learns much as he studies. He is able to retain what he learns and can pass it on to other Brethren. His ability and willingness to do this is commendable and very helpful to those with whom he associates, and is beneficial to our Masonic education. This makes him very important to our Fraternity and to the advancement of our high ideals".

"As Hiram slept, the widow's son So doth our Brothers take their rest; Life's battles fought, life's duties done Their faults forgot, their worth confessed; So let them sleep that dreamless sleep, Our sorrows clustering round their heads, Be comforted, ye loved who weep,




