As we progress through the Masonic Degrees the oaths and obligations taken therein are defined as covenants made with the institution of Freemasonry. The word "covenant" has such a broad and deep meaning it sometimes loses its full significance by becoming so familiar in our constant use of the term that we may fail to grasp the full impact of the responsibility it places on each of us as a Freemason. Brother Albert Mackey (Mackey's Revised Encyclopedia of Freemasonry, Volume 1) defines a covenant as "a contract or agreement between two or more parties on certain terms...). He further stated "...that when a man is made a Freemason he enters into a covenant with the institution. On his part he promises to fulfill certain promises, and to discharge certain duties, for which, on the other part, the Fraternity binds themselves by an equivalent covenant of friendship, protection and support". He went on to say that as the Freemason advances through the Masonic Degrees, the covenant must be repeated and modified accordingly by both sides; "that the covenant of an Entered Apprentice is different from that of a Fellow Craft, and the covenant of the latter from that of a Master Mason". He further makes an interesting observation that as we advance through the Degrees the covenant of each succeeding Degree is no less permanent because another has been added; "The second covenant does not impair the sanctity of the first". He concluded by noting "The covenant of Freemasonry . . . is the very foundation-stone which sup-


ports the whole edifice, and,

unless it be properly laid, no superstructure can with any safety be erected. It is indeed the covenant that makes the Freemason".

Consequently, it behooves us from time to time to stop and reflect on the full meaning of the many terms we become familiar with as we advance in our Masonic journey. Familiarity sometimes dulls the mind to some degree when we use the same term repeatedly and may cause one to overlook the full significance of a single word which has so much meaning.

LEGISLATION TO BE PRESENTED AT THE 215th ANNUAL COMMUNICATION OF THE GRAND LODGE OF KENTUCKY, FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS

ITEMS LAID OVER FOR THE 215th ANNUAL COMMUNICATION

Section 134 - Objection.

- (A) An objection to initiation, advancement or affiliation may be made by a member of the lodge, and the objection to initiation or affiliation shall have precisely the same effect, in every respect, as if the objector had cast an unfavorable ballot on the petition. An objection, to be valid, must be made before the preparation of the candidate in the case of initiation or advancement and before the ballot is taken in the case of affiliation. "Before the preparation of the candidate" shall be defined as before the candidate is conducted to the preparation room.
- (B) Objection to advancement shall prevent the candidate from receiving the degree for six months from the date the objective is, or should have been noted in the minutes: and after the expiration of six months the candidate may be advanced upon request without formal petition, but notice shall be given of the proposed advancement in open lodge.
- (C) Objection may be renewed, or other objection made in like manner and with the same effect within one week before the end of the six-month period or any succeeding six month period.
- (D) Such objection may be made in open lodge or to the Master privately and if made at a stated communication the objection shall be noted in the minutes without giving the name of the objector; and if not made or reported at a stated communication, then in every case the objection must be noted in the minutes of the next stated communication as above provided.
- (E) The objecting brother shall not be questioned as to his reasons, but he may give them if he chooses, and if he voluntarily states his reasons in open lodge, or privately to the Master who shall preserve the identity of the Brother making the objection and shall not reveal his identity to anyone, the lodge shall pass upon the sufficiency and validity of the objection, and a majority vote by ballot shall be necessary to sustain the objection. If not sustained the lodge shall proceed with the advancement of the candidate.
- (F) Any objection to advancement may be withdrawn by the objector in open lodge, or to the Master privately and the withdrawal must be noted in the minutes at a stated communication and the candidate may then be advanced.
- (G) Unless charges are preferred, no objection shall prevent an entered Apprentice or Fellow Craft Mason from participating fully in any degree which he has attained, or having a demit issued to him as provided in Section 149.

McNeil Lodge No. 586 wishes to submit the following changes for the 214th session. (Underlined)

Where as a Brother should have the right to know why he is not being advanced, and Where as the Lodge should have the right to decide on all actions of the Lodge. Be it resolved That Section 134 (C. D. E. & F) be changed to read.

- (A) An objection to initiation, advancement or affiliation may be made by a member of the lodge, and the objection to initiation or affiliation shall have precisely the same effect, in every respect, as if the objector had cast an unfavorable ballot on the petition. An objection, to be valid, must be made before the preparation of the candidate in the case of initiation or advancement and before the ballot is taken in the case of affiliation. "Before the preparation of the candidate" shall be defined as before the candidate is conducted to the preparation room.
- (B) Objection to advancement shall prevent the candidate from receiving the degree for six months from the date the objective is, or should have been noted in the minutes: and after the expiration of six months the candidate may be advanced upon request without formal petition, but notice shall be given of the proposed advancement in open lodge.
- (C) Objection may be renewed, at this time the objecting brother must state his objection, or Masonic charges must be filed on the Candidate within 30 days.
- (D) Such objection may be made in open lodge or to the Master privately in person and if made at a stated communication the objection shall be noted in the minutes without giving the name of the objector; and if not made or reported at a stated communication, then in every case the objection must be noted in the minutes of the next stated communication as above provided.
- (E) The objecting brother shall not be questioned but by the Master privately. The Master shall preserve the identity of the Brother making the objection and shall not reveal his identity to anyone, the lodge shall pass upon the sufficiency and validity of the objection, and a majority vote by ballot shall be necessary to sustain the objection. If not sustained the lodge shall proceed with the advancement of the candidate.
- (F) Any objection to advancement may be withdrawn by the objector in open lodge, or to the Master privately in person and the withdrawal must be noted in the minutes at a stated communication and the candidate may then be advanced.
- (G) Unless charges are preferred, no objection shall prevent an entered Apprentice

or Fellow Craft Mason from participating fully in any degree which he has attained, or having a demit issued to him as provided in Section 149.

Resolution: Camp Knox Lodge No. 919, at a stated Convocation on June 3, 2013, adopted the resolution for Grand Lodge to change the Constitution to add wording to the time between degrees recognizing the heroic contribution and sacrifices our service men make to our freedoms and that due not to their own choosing they are deployed to areas of hazard duty, the following change to Section 142 is proposed.

Section 143 - TIME BETWEEN DEGREES

As reads: The time between petition and initiation or affiliation and ballot thereon, and the time between each degree is a minimum of one lunar month, and the Grand Master is not authorized to dispense with this time, except in case or cases where it has been determined an Entered Apprentice and/or Fellow Craft Mason will not survive to be Raised a Master Mason under the aforementioned time constraint, the Grand Master is authorized to make the Entered Apprentice and/or Fellow Craft a Mason at Sight (2009)

Change to read: The time between petition and initiation or affiliation and ballot thereon, and the time between each degree is a minimum of one lunar month, and the Grand Master is not authorized to dispense with this time, except in case or cases where it has been determined an Entered Apprentice and/or Fellow Craft Mason will not survive to be Raised a Master Mason under the aforementioned time constraint, due to health condition or if a Service member being shipped to a Hazardous Duty Area, the Grand Master is authorized to make the Entered Apprentice and/or Fellow Craft a Mason at Sight (2009)

LODGE DUES SECTION 154. Dues to Fix and Collect. Each lodge shall fix and collect such annual dues as may be necessary to enable it to maintain itself and discharge its duties and obligations, payable before the Entered Apprentice Degree is conferred. The dues of all Lodges shall be due on January 1 each year, and payable in advance for the full year, except as provided by law as to Provisional Demits. Dues for each year shall be delinquent on April 1, and the delinquent members shall be subject to suspension on the stated meeting of the Lodge in June. Any lodge failing to collect dues from a brother, for more than one year, and failing to notify said brother of his delinquency each year, shall forfeit the right to collect more than one years delinquent dues from said member, and on payment of same, said

member shall be in good standing with his Lodge.

Amend to read:

LODGE DUES SECTION 154. Dues to Fix and Collect. Each lodge shall fix and collect such annual dues as may be necessary to enable it to maintain itself and discharge its duties and obligations, payable before the Entered Apprentice Degree is conferred. The dues of all Lodges shall be due on January 1 each year, and payable in advance for the full year, except as provided by law as to Provisional Demits. Dues for each year shall be delinquent on January 1, and the delinquent members shall be subject to suspension, on the stated meeting of the Lodge in June. At the discretion of the subordinate Lodge, no earlier than the April stated meeting of the subordinate Lodge. Any lodge failing to collect dues from a brother, for more than one year, and failing to notify said brother of his delinquency each year, shall forfeit the right to collect more than one years delinquent dues from said member, and on payment of same, said member shall be in good standing with his Lodge. Any Brother suspended under this section shall be subject to reinstatement as set out in Section 187 of this Constitu-

This change is submitted to make Section 154 consistent with our current dues structure as indicated on our dues card, which states that the past year's dues have been paid "through December 31.20xx.

This change also addresses changes made in the reinstatement process in Section 187 as amended at the Kentucky Grand Lodge Communication in 2012 as follows:

SECTION 187-

After Suspension for Non-Payment.

A brother suspended for non-payment of dues shall rest under suspension until he has submitted a petition for reinstatement to the lodge from which he was first suspended, which petition must be referred to and be reported on by committee the same as any other petition for membership, paid the amount owing up to the time of suspension, and re-elected to membership by unanimous ballot of the membership present.

ITEM NO. 1 Section 118 – RESERVED

Change to read:

Section 118-BURIAL OF SUSPENDED FOR NON-PAYMENT OF DUES MASON. Masonic burial of a suspended for non-payment of dues Mason cannot be demanded as a right, but may be accorded as a favor to the family only

if the lodge agrees to perform such burial service (1) on a case by case basis.

ITEM NO. 2

Franklin Lodge number 28 proposes to amend the Constitution of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, quorum votes section 20. This amendment is for the purpose of preparing and educating our junior officers for the leadership role of being master of their Lodge.

Section 20 now reads.

Vote-Who may. Each elected grand Lodge officer, Past Grand Master and the representative from each subordinate Lodge shall have one vote and no more; Past Masters shall have one vote collectively no one shall vote by proxy.

Shall be amended to read.

Section 20 vote – Who may. Each elective Grand Lodge Officer, Past Grand Master, The Top 3 Officers (Master, Senior Warden, Junior Warden) from each subordinate Lodge or the elected representative of each Lodge shall have one vote each and no more; Past Masters shall have one vote collectively and no one shall vote by proxy.

ITEM NO. 4

Section 16. Communication. The Grand Lodge of Kentucky shall hold its Annual Communication in Jefferson County on the third Monday in October each year, except that the Grand Master with consent of a majority of the Elected Grand Lodge Officers may change the place of Communication to some other county in Kentucky if they shall find it in the best interest of the Craft in the matter of publicity and hotel accommodations, or for any other reason or reasons which to such officers may appear sufficient; provided notice is given to the Craft prior to August 1st either by mail or by publication in the *Masonic Home Journal*.

Changed to read.

Section 16. The Grand Lodge of Kentucky shall hold its Annual Communication in Kentucky on the third Monday in October each year.

ITEM NO. 5 Section 37. The Duties of the Grand Treasurer are:

- To receive all money of the Grand Lodge at the hands of the Grand Secretary, giving receipts therefor.
- (2) To deposit at interest in some good solvent bank, or trust company, to be selected by him, such money as may, from time to time, come into his hands. Should more money accumulate than may be necessary to liquidate the debts of the Grand Lodge and pay the current expenses, the same shall be invested by him in such interest-bearing securities as may be approved by the Grand Master and the Finance Committee, which investment shall be reported to the Grand Lodge at its next session.
- (3) To pay out money of the Grand Lodge only on warrants or supporting papers received, with two (2) of the three (3) qualified signatures. Namely Grand Master, Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer.
- (4) To take receipts on a pay-roll (or otherwise) for money paid during the session of the Grand Lodge for mileage and per diem and for appropriations made by the Grand Lodge. He shall certify to said pay-roll, or copy thereof, and promptly file one of them with the Grand Secretary, receiving in exchange therefor a regular warrant to cover the amounts so paid.
- 5) To account for all money and property received, paid or transferred to him, and to submit a full statement of his accounts, with books and vouchers, to the Grand Lodge on the first day of its Annual Communication, or when required, which shall be referred to the Finance Committee for examination and report.
- To give bond, with some reliable and satisfactory company as surety, in the penal sum of not less than one hundred thousand dollars, payable to the Grand Lodge of Kentucky which bond shall be conditioned to receive and pay over or deliver all money, books, papers, and other property entrusted to him as Grand Treasurer, or any part thereof, upon the requisition of the Grand Lodge or its authorized officers or agents, and in all requests faithfully to perform his duties as Grand Treasurer. He shall not enter upon his duties as Grand Treasurer until said bond is executed, approved by the Grand Master and filed by the Grand Secretary. If he fails to execute and file such a bond within ten days next after his installation, the Grand Master may appoint a Grand Treasurer who will do so. The premium on said bond shall be paid by regular warrant.

We propose to add:

(7) The Grand Treasurer shall serve no more than ten (10) years.

ITEM NO. 6

Section 38. The duties of the Grand Secretary are:

- To receive all money due or paid to the Grand Lodge and promptly pay the same to the Grand Treasurer.
- (2) To attend personally and by his Assis-

- tants, at every communication of the Grand Lodge, with his books and papers.
- (3) To keep true minutes of the proceedings of the Grand Lodge, proper to be written, cause the same to be printed in such manner as the Grand Lodge may direct and preserve a copy of the same in his office.
- (4) To procure all books and stationery required for the use of the Grand Lodge.
- (5) To examine monthly reports and annual returns of lodges, correct errors, of any, and make proper entries of the same to the debit or credit of the respective lodges and report all delinquencies to the Grand Lodge.
- (6) To send notice of indebtedness, at least once quarterly to all lodges in arrers.

- (8) To cause amendments to *The Book of Constitutions* to be codified and printed in *Masonic Home Journal* and send a copy to each lodge and person entitled thereto.
- (9) To keep a regular set of books, which shall show the complete financial condition of the Grand Lodge, including accounts with subordinate lodges.

We propose to add:

(10) The Grand Secretary shall serve no more than ten (10) years.

CATIONS. The stated communications of the lodge shall be held at least monthly, at such place and time as may be specified in the Charter or Dispensation, or authorized by the Grand Lodge and at such times as may be designated in its by- laws. However, the master of a lodge is permitted to cancel up to two meetings in a year due to conditions that make it unsafe for its members to attend lodge. In a case where the lodge is cancelled due to this exception, the secretary of said lodge shall notify their DDGM, state the cause of the cancel, document the reason in their next minutes. The DDGM shall notify the area officer of this cancel.

Failure to hold stated communications, as provided in this section of the Constitution shall authorize the Grand Master to place said lodge on probation, where said lodge must furnish a full past years minutes showing that this was a singular circumstance. If other concerns war-

rant additional action, at this discretion, the Grand Master may arrest the charter of the lodge or other action as he may deem appropriate.

Exception to this rule for any declared state of emergency by city, county, or state that affects said lodge.
