Burnside Lodge No. 634 members recently took part in the unveiling of the new Boy Scout sign erected in Burnside, Kentucky.



PART SIX OF THE SERIES: <u>PROPER PROTOCOL</u>

As we wrapped up District meetings one of the most frequently asked questions was what is proper protocol. What is proper protocol? The only reference I could find in the *Kentucky Monitor* was on pages 324 – 330, Regulations for Processions. The Grand

Master should always be addressed as Most Worshipful and when introduced he is the Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. After being introduced he should be escorted to the East and given the private Grand Honors. The other elected Grand Lodge Officers are always addressed as Right Worshipful and afforded the public Grand Honors beginning with the Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Junior Warden, Grand Senior Warder, and Deputy Grand Master, Past Grand Masters should be addressed as Most Worshipful and given public Grand Honors. The appointed Grand Lodge Officers, District Deputy Grand Master, and Grand Lodge Committee Men are addressed as Worshipful and given the public Grand Honors. One note about the District Deputy Grand Master, when he is on his official Lodge visit the only outranking Officer would be the Grand Master himself. The Masters of all Lodges are also addressed as Worshipful Master with the

rest of the membership being addressed as Brother. This is somewhat of a condensed version but my hope is that this may help clarify proper protocol and encourage you to research further through prior education conference materials. A good Lodge education program is practicing introductions using proper protocol.

As we embark on the lazy, hazy days of summer, enjoy spending time with your family and friends, along with your Masonic family. There are many Masonic activities that take place in the summer months such as outdoor raisings, family nights, and community events where we can...

Please note that your Annual Return will be available for you to review on July 1, 2015.

THIS YEAR ALL OF YOUR CORRECTIONS WILL NEED TO BE MADE BY JULY 10, 2015.

AFTER THIS DATE NO MORE CHANGES WILL BE MADE.

To view your Annual Return you will need to log into the system and on your HOME page you will find ALERTS on the right of your screen. It will say "Run your Annual Return Report," once you click that it will pull up your Annual Return. You need to look it over and make sure it is correct. If there is something wrong with your report you are required to make the changes yourself. If you find that you cannot make the changes, please contact Jamie at the Grand Lodge Office at 502-893-0192. Again your changes have to be made BY JULY 10, 2015. Once the changes are made and they

have been approved, run your Annual Return again (*Click on reports then click on Annual Return*) and make sure that the changes are reflected, once it is correct go to the bottom of the *page and click "Testify your return report is accurate.*" Once this is done, it will send the Grand Lodge Office a notification and will mark your return as done. The amount at the bottom of the page is the amount due for your Annual Return.

YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE AN INVOICE FOR YOUR BALANCE DUE.

This total will be at the bottom of your Accurate Annual Return. Payment can be made by check or credit card. Phone the Grand Lodge Office to pay with credit card at 502-893-0192. Lincoln Lodge 60





The Declaration of Independence

We celebrate American Independence Day on the Fourth of July every year. We think of July 4, 1776, as a day that represents the Declaration of Independence and the birth of the United States of America as an independent nation.

But July 4, 1776 wasn't the day that the Continental Congress decided to declare independence (they did that on July 2, 1776).

It wasn't the day we started the American Revolution either (that had happened back in April 1775).

And it wasn't the day Thomas Jefferson wrote the first draft of the Declaration of Independence (that was in June 1776). Or the date on which the Declaration was delivered to Great Britain (that didn't happen until November 1776). Or the date it was signed (that was August 2, 1776).

So what did happen on July 4, 1776?

The Continental Congress approved the final wording of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. They'd been working on it for a couple of days after the draft was submitted on July 2nd and finally agreed on all of the edits and changes.

July 4, 1776, became the date that was included on the Declaration of Independence, and the fancy handwritten copy that was signed in August (the copy now displayed at the National Archives in Washington, D.C.) It's also the date that was printed on the Dunlap Broadsides, the original printed copies of the Declaration that were circulated throughout the new nation. So when people thought of the Declaration of Independence, July 4, 1776 was the date they remembered.

In contrast, we celebrate Constitution Day on September 17th of each year, the anniversary of the date the Constitution was signed, not the anniversary of the date it was approved. If we'd followed this same approach for the Declaration of Independence we'd being celebrating Independence Day on August 2nd of each year, the day the Declaration of Independence was signed!

How did the Fourth of July become a national holiday?

For the first 15 or 20 years after the Declaration was written, people didn't celebrate it much on any date. It was too new and too much else was happening in the young nation. By the 1790s, a time of bitter partisan conflicts, the Declaration had become controversial. One party, the Democratic-Republicans, admired Jefferson and the Declaration. But the other party, the Federalists, thought the Declaration was too French and too anti-British, which went against their current policies.

By 1817, John Adams complained in a letter that America seemed uninterested in its past. But that would soon change.

After the War of 1812, the Federalist party began to come apart and the new parties of the 1820s and 1830s all considered themselves inheritors of Jefferson and the Democratic-Republicans. Printed copies of the Declaration began to circulate again, all with the date July 4, 1776, listed at the top. The deaths of Thomas Jefferson and John Adams on July 4, 1826, may even have helped to promote the idea of July 4 as an important date to be celebrated.

Celebrations of the Fourth of July became more common as the years went on and in 1870, almost a hundred years after the Declaration was written, Congress first declared July 4 to be a national holiday as part of a bill to officially recognize several holidays, including Christmas. Further legislation about national holidays, including July 4, was passed in 1939 and 1941.

Volunteers pitch in on Great Day


