The two issues that I want to talk about include the good works you do during the holiday season so others can enjoy the example of giving and service set down by our Lord, Jesus Christ, and the second is the great respect and debt we owe our Veterans and our men and women currently serving in all branches of the United States Military.

First, as I am writing this article for The Masonic Home Jour*nal*, the weather outside is turning cold and Christmas is just around the corner. God has blessed each and every one of us

As your Grand Lodge Officers travel across the Commonwealth, we see many proud Kentucky Freemasons who provide food, clothing, shelter, gifts and HOPE to those who are less fortunate than we are. Your Grand Officers know firsthand how much support is given by you and your Lodge to widow's programs, local schools, Masonic Homes of Kentucky, the Grand Lodge and a wide variety of other programs. The number of nursing home visits, fruit baskets delivered to widows, clothes and food to needy families, and all other kinds of charitable works reflect the type of servant leadership we should aspire to as men who believe in Biblical principles and the example set forth by the true Master Builder. I want to publicly thank acts of kindness

and charity this season. You are doing the things we need to do in order to be relevant in today's society. Many

people are noticing and applauding your efforts. Also, many Lodges are pursuing the Grand Masters Excellency Award this year, and the numbers of bicycles being placed in schools to promote good student attendance are increasing rapidly. By positively influencing a child to improve his or her life by regularly attending school, you are helping chart the course of society. You are being successful at a huge task. I am very confident that all the elementary schools in at least two dozen counties now have bicycles donated by Masons. As another example of your good work, Brothers in Masonic District #2 have placed bikes in every public elementary school in the entire district! To underscore how well your work is proceeding, I want you to know that I am getting telephone calls from school administrators across the State asking, "Why are the Masons donating bikes to our schools?" I am very happy to tell them,

"Because proud Kentucky Freemasons want our children to learn to read, become productive citizens, and improve their lives." Brothers, I do not know how to convey the extent to which I am humbled before you as you complete this task which is bigger than any one person could ever hope to achieve. I can only say thank you from the bottom of my heart.

The second item I want to address today is that of Masons supporting our military men and women. I am so very proud of Kentucky Freemasons for being patriotic and concerned about the welfare of our Veterans and those currently serving in our armed forces. Money generated through the sale of Grand Lodge of Kentucky Veteran's Pins has, for several years, helped fund activities held by Lodges to honor our Veteran's and Military Personnel through deployment parties, reeach and every one of you for your turning home parties, breakfasts,

recognitions, etc. I want to strongly encourage our Lodges to hold similar events, or partner with other Lodges to do so, in their communities. The men and women who secure

our freedoms and allow us to live in the "Land of the Free and the Home of the Brave" deserve much more than we can ever repay. Brothers, as you have heard me say many times before, "If you can read, thank a teacher. If you can read in English, thank the American soldier."

Finally, I want to share with vou three instances of Masonic Brotherhood I witnessed on Saturday, December 5, 2015 that show who you truly are in your hearts. First, as I was traveling from my home in Somerset to a Masonic Breakfast in Bardstown to honor our military personnel. I stopped at the Stanford McDonald's for a cup of coffee. As I was ordering, I noticed a gentleman wearing a ball cap upon which was embroidered the Masonic Square and Compass. He, and several other members of Lincoln Lodge No. 60, were at the back table with a list of Masonic Widows names and addresses spread out before them. The Brothers

were planning the fund raising, purchase, and delivery of Christmas Fruit Baskets to these widows, many of whom either lived alone or were in nursing homes. These men were taking a beautiful Saturday morning to do what we all swore we would do, look after our widows and be real men. When I arrived at the Veteran's Breakfast in Bardstown, which was sponsored by Bardstown and Louisville area Lodges, I saw a room full of young men in dress uniform along with their ladies. The young men I met and talked to are devoted to our country, smart, well mannered, and prepared for leadership. On the advice of Brother Bill Riggs, I gave each man there one of my Veteran's Pins which depicts Brother George Washington praying on bended knees for our troops at Valley Forge. I saw many potential proud Kentucky Freemasons at that dinner, if they know who we are and what we stand for. These young men would not have been assembled there this Saturday morning except for Masons who gave up their weekend, worked the breakfast to honor our military, and do what we all swore we would do, be real men. Finally, I travelled to the Grand Junior Warden's reception held at Natural Bridge in Slade, Kentucky. An honest count showed 350 Masons traveled from every county in the Commonwealth to honor Gary Rose and renew old friendships and break bread with each other in the process. As the keynote speaker, Past Grand Master Herman Forrester said as part of his speech, "Masons swore to be real men." Brothers, I share my Saturday, December 5, 2015 with you to emphasize that the bonds that bind us together are thrice strong and not easily broken. I deeply appreciate all you do to build up Freemasonry and pass it on to the next generation of, real men.
