

If there is something wrong with your report you are required to make the changes yourself. If you find that you cannot make the changes please contact Jamie at the Grand Lodge Office at 502-893-0192. Again your changes have to be made BY JULY 15, 2016. Once the changes are made and they have been approved, run your Annual Return again (Click on reports then click on Annual Return) and make sure that the changes are reflected, once it is correct go to the bottom of the page and click "Testify you return report is accurate". Once this is done, it will send the Grand Lodge Office a notification and will mark your return as done. The amount at the bottom of the page is the amount due for your Annual Return. YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE AN INVOICE FOR YOUR BALANCE DUE. This total will be at the bottom of your Accurate Annual Return. "BOOK OF CONSTITUTIONS

(With Former Sections included)'

The Constitution has been reformatted by gathering scattered sections of our existing 2015 Constitution and moving them to a more comprehensive group setting.

We are requesting that the Grand Lodge Web page have this posted for your review and comparison.

The Jurisprudence Committee has been working diligently with the Craft and the Lodge Officers in mind. We are going to be very transparent in our recommendation. You can see this document at https://grandlodgeofkentucky.org/

With all the Sections included, there are no changes to the present Constitution.

Therefore this Re-Structured printing is all that we will be asking you to vote upon at this Fall 2016 Grand Lodge Session.

This will only require a simple majority vote to adopt and will not need to layover over, as would a Constitutional change.



A Way to Celebrate by Howard Coop

On July 4, 2016, in observance of Independence Day, this nation will celebrate, in one way or another, the 240th anniversary of the unanimous adoption of the Declaration of Independence by the Congress of the original thirteen colonies.

Consisting of only 1,364 words, the Declaration of Independence is short, but it is

powerful. It is powerful. It is recognized as the greatest document of American History. Francis Samuel Philbrick, a professor of law at the University of Pennsylvania, called it "the best known and the noblest of American State papers," and Rewey

Belle Inglis, in ADVENTURES IN AMERICAN LITERATURE, wrote, the Declaration of Independence "is the finest expression of the American ideal ever formulated."

That short document set forth six basic principles that are the bedrock of American democracy. (1) All persons "are created equal." Therefore, we are a classless society; no one has a superior rank. (2). Everyone is "endowed by the Creator with certain unalienable rights." These rights are "Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." (3). To secure these rights, "Governments are instituted among men." (4). Those governments derive "their just powers from the consent of the governed." (5). When "any form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or abolish it, and to institute a new Government." (6). Then, there is an underlying principle: "Prudence, indeed, will dictate, that Governments long established should not be changed for light

and transient causes."

Richard Stockton, George Walton, and William Whipple---were Masons. "With a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence" and recognizing the risk involved, those fifty-six patriots pledged to each other "our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor" and signed that document that broke ties with England and formed a new nation.

There are many ways to celebrate Independence Day. There will be fireworks, parades, and oratorical flourishes, but one way to celebrate it is to read that short, but powerful document, and for a few minutes, reflect upon its significance for our nation and for you.

The Gladys and Jack Jonas Trust bequeaths \$1.4 million gift to Masonic Homes



Roby "Jack" Jonas and his wife Gladys quietly built a legacy of honesty, hard work and financial responsibility throughout their lives. Jack was a Mason, and Gladys was an Eastern Star. Longtime friend and business associate Virgil Hall says, "He lived the life of a Mason more than he attended the lodge ... They were great people. She was a teammate with him."

Jack Jonas passed away in 1998, and Gladys died at the age of 93 in 2014. Their unassuming, hardworking life and good stewardship is now bearing fruit for organizations they held close to their hearts. The Gladys and Roby "Jack" Jonas Trust gifted \$1.25 million to Masonic Homes of Kentucky in late 2014, and the Homes recently received the final distribution from that trust. Other equal beneficiaries of the estate were Hosparus and the American Red Cross.

The Jonas gift is one of the largest we have ever received, and we are grateful for their dedication to one of the basic premises of Masonry – that is, to care for those who often are unable to provide fully for themselves.


