JOHN ED MOYERS

Brother Moyers entered upon eternal rest Sunday, July 16, 2017. Masonic Services were conducted at Fern Creek Funeral Home, 5406 Bardstown Rd., Louisville, Kentucky on Thursday, July 20, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. by the Officers and Brethren of Buechel Lodge No. 896, F. & A. M. Brother Roland Stayton conducted the Masonic Funeral Rites as Acting Master of Buechel Lodge No. 896. Many other Masonic dignitaries and Brethren were attendance.

Brother Moyers, the son of the late John Henry Moyers and Ruby Nicholson Moyers, was born in Bardwell, Kentucky on November 28, 1930. He was educated in the Jefferson County Public School System, and graduated from Fern Creek High School and attended the University of Louisville.

Brother Moyers served his country in the U.S. Army 1950-1953. He was a member of Buechel Volunteer Fire Department, a member of the

Kiwanis International, and a member of the Bardstown Road Improvement Association.

Brother Moyers was a member of Beargrass Christian Church, Louisville Kentucky, and served as Treasurer, Board Chair, and other Offices.

Brother John Moyers and Pauline Sharp Moyers were married on November 11, 1949 and were blessed with two children, Donna R. Cissell and Mary R. Broyles.

Brother Moyers served as District Deputy Grand Master District No. 14, 1963, Grand Sword Bearer 1972 and Grand Pursuivant in 1973. He continued to serve the Grand Lodge of Kentucky on many Grand Lodge Committees and in other capacities, following his term as Grand Master.

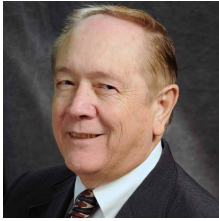

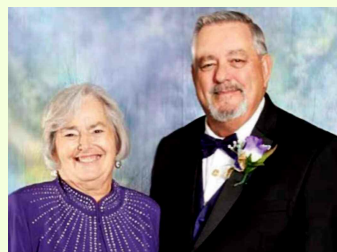
