

My brothers all,

By the time you read this, almost half of the district meetings will have been concluded. I am happy to report that they have all been well attended and brotherly love has prevailed in each instance. He was one of my Masonic Mentors and understood well the geometry of the lodge in addition to the "rithmetic" of working a mule to feed his family. My grandpa lived in a different time than we do now, but he knew that preserving our Masonic history and passing it onto the next generation was very important.

To contribute to maintaining our history, I ask you to help locate the gravesites of Past Grand Masters of Kentucky, the locations of which are presently unknown for many. Please record the cemetery name, take a picture and GPS reading of the location and provide driving directions to the site. Once this information has been collected, send it to our Grand Secretary at his e-mail address. This is a very important way you can help preserve our history.

My brothers, In addition to the district and education meetings, I am happy to report that your Grand Lodge Officers have been traveling the state through rain, snow and sunshine to visit your lodges. They tell me that brotherly love, peace and harmony are prevailing in Kentucky Freemasonry and much proficient work is being done. As I have mentioned before, our ritual is the center part of a candidate's experience and we owe it to them to do the very best ritual work we can. I look forward to seeing you, my brothers, in lodge as I continue to make my rounds across the Commonwealth!





MASONIC LIBRARY AND MUSEUM ASSOCIATION COVINGTON SCOTTISH RITE

"I Didn't Know That....."

Have you ever wondered what it would be like if in the Master Mason Degree you received the 'real' word, instead of the 'substitute' word of a Master? The "Ancien Rite de Bouillon", an old English ritual purported to have been used by at least by two lodges in England around 1740, does just that! Only two manuscript copies are known to exist, however John T. Thorp reprinted the old ritual as #9 in his series of "Reproductions of Masonic Manuscripts, Books and Pamphlets" through the Lodge of Research #2496 in Leicester, in 1926.

Royal Arch Masons will notice that a heavy flavor of York Rite masonry is given throughout the third degree ritual as it represents an unusual version of the Master's degree. In fact, Reverand George Oliver, a Masonic writer in the early nineteenth century, devoted 21 pages to this manuscript in his book "The Origin of the Royal Arch". Although today, fault has been found with many of Dr. Oliver's writings, this book is a very worthwhile read!

Why "Ancien Rite de Bouillon"? According to the ritual, Godfrey de Bouillon was the leader of the first crusade in the 11th century, was named King of Jerusalem, and made a discovery of the Epistle written by St. John at Ephesus. This is not the only reason the manuscript is so interesting. The 'Rite" represents the Masters degree in use before the separation of the Royal Arch.


Thorp's reprint lists thirty points of interest differing from well-known English rituals. A partial list includes: "The frequent recital of passages of Scripture in Latin (Vulgate Version). Two Nos. are given to every Psalm quoted in the transcript, the higher Nos. in each case are according to the Vulgate, while the lower (in brackets), always used in the original MS., are according to the Septuagint (Greek Version)". "Transposition of the First and Second Degree words. This was ordered about the year1739, to prevent unqualified persons obtaining admission to the Lodges and was continued until the year 1809."

"Geometric Masters. "According to the Laws and Regulations for the Royal Arch Degree as worked by the 'Ancients', a candidate had to be a Geometric Master Mason before he could receive the degree. (Ah. Rez, 1807, pp.110, 111.) The precise meaning of the term is uncertain, but it is probably the same as Speculative or Geomatic".

Among other variances from English rituals are "the absence of the Sr. Warden from the Lodge, and subsequently of the Jr. Warden, a most unusual obligation, the search and discovery, two assassins, the medal and the figures engraved". The phrase, "Alas! Poor Hiram" is used at the closing of the Lodge.

Dr. Oliver thought very highly of three degrees of the "Ancien Rite de Boullion" as many do today. Others are more skeptical of the ritual. Certainly, in some areas it seems more advanced in Royal Arch Masonry than other early known Royal Arch rituals. Regardless, it is definitely unusual and most entertaining, to say the least.

As a side note; Ben Jonson's Lodge #106 (later renumbered #94) was constituted in 1732 and was known to use the "Ancient Rite de Bouillon" ritual. They practiced Ancient Masonry every third meeting. It happened that on one of these nights, some Modern Masons attempted to visit but were refused admittance, whereby a complaint was issued to the Modern Grand Lodge, who ordered Ben Jonson's Lodge to



"admit all sorts of Masons without distinction". Because of non-compliance, the Ben Jonson's Lodge was censured and subsequently erased in 1755.

The first and second degrees are not included however enough excerpts of these two degrees are presented to illustrate the major differences of this ritual, from the standard English rituals. ----What do you think?


within your Symbolic Lodge. **IF** it was issued prior to the 1970's, it should say something of about Ancient York Freemasonry.
