

"I Didn't Know That....."

Did you ever think about the downsizing of Lodge membership, and what a Masonic Lodge will look like in the somewhat near future? It is almost certain that things will be changing, as reduced membership, equates to reduced Lodge money, for charity, membership banquets, and building expenses. Certainly a Lodge can raise dues but how far can they raise them until many brethren decide that they do not want to pay and drop their membership? Then it is back to losing more members as well as their dues. So what can a Lodge do and what kind of Lodges will we have?

Obviously a Lodge could eliminate their outside charity work as nothing in the 'old charges' or early Lodge minutes ever reflected that charity should be extended outside the Lodge membership. However a member was expected to make a donation to the Charity Fund for



when an impoverished Brother was in need. A Lodge could eliminate large banquets, such as Family Day, or one with outside guests. However the fellowship of the Lodge has always been built around the table so if continued, a charge would have to be placed on the members for any food consumed. These two things if applied, would lower expenses, but is a rather small change compared to building maintenance and related expenses. Less dollars means more Lodges in need of repair and/or eventually sold.

That makes three choices. A Lodge can combine with another Lodge to share expenses, rent the building to the public during times when the Lodge is not in use, or get rid of the building, the maintenance, the gas and electric bills. The first two are uncertain income, but getting rid of the building means getting rid of major expenses, and is possibly more desirable than one would think.

A lodge without a building could meet in a private room in a restaurant, as in early times when they met in the upstairs room of taverns. Possibly they could meet at a brother's home also done in early times. Another possibility would be meeting in a church and performing any fund raising activity to fulfill the church's need. Casual meetings would then be more prevalent than formal meetings. What about Lodge equipment? What do you need? Now what do you really and truly need? Meetings with degree work may require a rental. This kind of Lodge would certainly have to have approval from the Grand Lodge.

In California, there are now 'Lodges without buildings' that hold their meetings at different and unusual places. They try to find a new, unique and interesting place for each meeting. A creative mind can do wonders. This alone has proven to help increase attendance among their members as well as guests.

One other possibility would be attending lodge by computer, I am not certain if lodges of E-masonry would be effective as a replacement for Freemasonry, although fellowship and friendship can develop in such Masonic Groups.

Small Lodges are not a bad thing. As matter-of-fact large Lodges were discouraged by Kentucky's first Grand Constitution (Illustrations of Masonry -1808- page 46); "...although more than forty or fifty (members) ...are generally found inconvenient for working to advantage; and therefore, when a lodge becomes too numerous, some of the ablest master workman, and others under their direction, will obtain leave to separate and apply to the Grand Lodge for a warrant to work by themselves...". And again in the same Kentucky Grand Constitution on page 48, concerning withdrawing membership; "unless the lodge becomes too numerous for working; in which case, a sufficient number may withdraw with the approbation of their lodge, in order to form a new one".

What about moving a Lodge from place to place? In the 1808 Constitutions, it seems that some problems arose at some Kentucky lodges when a Master was absent, the brethren voted to move the Lodge to another place. So a detailed rule was put in place that the Master must be present during such a vote, and if it differed from the Master's wish, it would require 2/3rds ballot to pass, but only a majority, if it was the Master's desire (see pages 52 and 53).

Certainly Lodges are changing. The expected increase in membership never came. Lodges without buildings will no doubt become more prevalent. Small lodges mean higher percentage in attendance, closer fellowship, and less financial problems. Candidates could be brought around to casual meetings for a closer examination. This I believe, is a good thing!.........What do you think?
