

The Grand Lodge will be holding a Ritual Competition to recognize the importance of ritual excellence within our Commonwealth. The purpose of the competition is to inspire lodges to focus on meaningful ritual to deepen members' and candidates' experiences, and to raise the standard of ritual excellence in our craft.

We know that many of you are excellent ritualists and we hope you will participate in the competition and be recognized for your efforts. The Kentucky Monitor by Henry Pirtle will be used as the primary source for judging purposes in the 2019-2020 competition. Brother Clayton E. Stoess, Sr. celebrated his 102nd birthday on July 4, 2020. He is a lifelong native of Crestwood, Kentucky. Born on July 4th, 1918 in his parents' home in Crestwood, Kentucky. He attended Crestwood Elementary, Crestwood High School, and graduated from the University of Louisville in 1940 with a degree in chemical engineering.

Bro. Stoess enlisted in the U.S. Navy and received training at Columbia University and Cornell University. He served in the United States Navy for 4 years on a minesweeper off the coast of Normandy just before troops landed on D-Day. He was sent to the Pacific theater after V-J Day to clear mines in the bay of Japan. He was discharged from the military and returned home in 1946.

Involved in community service his whole life he worked in the family businesses; a hardware store, and a funeral home. Bro. Stoess helped to found the South Oldham Lion's Club, was the Chairman of the Oldham County Board of Education for 16 years and served on the Crestwood City Council until he retired... at 100. Bro. Stoess was also a founding member of the South Oldham Fire Department.

He is a Past Master of Pewee Valley Lodge No. 829, serving as Master in 1953, and has been a member of the lodge for 72 years.

His friends and family organized a parade on July 4, 2020 and the city of Crestwood honored his birthday, driving by his house to wish him a very Happy Birthday!

"I Didn't Know That....."

On December 24, 1865, shortly after the War Between the States, and during the Reconstruction of the South, six Confederate veterans met at Pulaski, Tennessee to form the Ku Klux Klan. A few years thereafter, Nathan Bedford Forrest became the Imperial Wizard of the Ku Klux Klan.

Before the Civil War, Forrest was one of the richest men in the South through his slave trading business and Mississippi cotton plantations. He even held political office as Memphis city alderman for two terms. He entered the Confederate States Army as a private 1861. In spite of having no military experience he quickly impressed his superiors and was soon commissioned a lieutenant colonel and given command of the 3rd Tennessee Calvary. He led his men into several well-known operations including the Battle of Shiloh, Chickamauga, Brie Crossroads, and Second Franklin. His relentless pursuit to destroy Union communication and supply lines in West Tennessee also took him as far north to Kentucky where he distinguished himself in the Battle of Sacramento (McClain County – December 28, 1861), the Battle of Donelson on the Tennessee-Kentucky border (Feb. 11 – 16, 1862) and the Battle of Paducah (Ft. Anderson - March 25, 1864). By the end of the War, Nathan Forrest rose in rank from Private to Lt. General.

Nathan Bedford Forrest who once was wounded by a bullet but continued to lead his troops in a charge against the Union, gained the nickname 'The Wizard in the Saddle' for his heroic exploits. He was the only man in the Confederacy who entered as a Private and advanced to Lieutenant General. But one major military disgrace would haunt him for the rest of his life. At the Battle of Pillow (April 12, 1864), he forced the surrender of the mostly black Union soldiers. His men decided to bayonet and shoot them after they surrendered. Union newspapers played up the event, even claiming women and children were included in the horrible and cold blooded slaughter, but none of their bodies were found among the dead. Forrest denied any knowledge whatsoever of this disgraceful massacre and tried to explain it all away to anyone who would listen. However, there was a massacre under his command, and this would haunt him for the rest of his life.

At the end of the Civil War, the South was overrun with groups of returning Confederate soldiers who wanted the South to be what it as before the war. They wanted the slaves to return to their masters and used intimidation to frighten them into staying or returning. One of these groups was the Ku Klux Klan. By early 1868, some of the leaders of the Ku Klux Klan wanted to organize the numerous Klan groups and operate under one central head. The 'Wizard of the Saddle' became the first (and only) Grand Wizard of the Ku Klux Klan. Rules and regulations were drawn, and plans were laid. The Grand Wizard attended the 1868 Democratic Convention as a delegate and witnessed his friend Frank Blair Jr's nomination for Vice President to run with Horatio Seymour for President with the slogan "Our Ticket, Our Motto, This is White Man's Country; Let White Men Rule" with a platform rejecting the Reconstruction Acts as well as any program that assisted the former slaves. The KKK originally wore masks and made midnight raids on blacks, threatening violence, and sometimes with beatings. This escalated in 1868, the year of the election, to killing many blacks as well white sympathizers, to intimidate the voters. Actually, this played into the hand of the Republicans and Civil War hero and

Forrest's nemesis, Ulysses S. Grant won the Presidential election.

With Grant as President the 14th and 15th amendments of the Constitution were passed giving blacks equal protection under the law and the right to vote. As the Klan was out of control, Forrest decided to officially disband the Ku Klux Klan in January, 1869. He had served just one year as Grand Wizard. However, many continued their groups, and later 1,000 Klansmen were convicted of various crimes. A Congressional Committee on Klan activities led Forrest to testify, saying only that he knew some people involved but was not a member. He later admitted he had lied to protect some of his friends who were active members. The Klan disintegrated in 1871.

It appears that Forrest had a major change of heart, and perhaps regretted some of his deeds. He wrote the Governor of Tennessee in August 1874 his willingness to help "exterminate" those who continue to show violence against the black race. On July 5, 1875 Forrest gave a speech to a black equal rights group. The speech contained elements of encouragement and hope for better relations for black and white Americans. A young black woman gave him a bouquet of flowers. He thanked her and gave her a kiss on the cheek.

His beloved South had lost the war, his reputation was destroyed due to the Battle of Pillow massacre, the Democratic Party had lost the Presidential election, the Ku Klux Klan, he wanted nothing to do with and his railroad business had failed. Nathan Bedford Forrest died in his brother's home on October 29, 1877 at the age of 54.

Oh, was he a Mason? Yes and no! He took the Entered Apprentice degree in Angerona Lodge #168, Memphis, Tennessee, but never attended lodge again or advanced beyond this introductory degree.

In 1915 it was re-established strangely enough, due to a popular but controversial movie "The Clansman" (later changed to "Birth of a Nation"). The movie was based on the 1905 book by Thomas Dixon and a one act play that was banned in several cities. The movie praised the Confederacy and glorified the Klan placing them in white robes and burning crosses. It introduced for the first time, certain dramatic camera technics that enhanced the film. At the end of that year a meeting was held at Stone Mountain, Atlanta, Georgia re-establishing the Klan.

It was during "the golden age of fraternities" and the more fraternities one belonged too, the more one's reputation was enhanced. The Klan was well accepted and it grew rapidly. Membership is said to have reached 5,000,000 due to their sales technics. Patriotism, white robes and the cross (all adopted from the movie), were popular with most other fraternities. Recruiters were paid and instructed on how to solicit membership, especially from other fraternities, and more especially the Masons. These solicitors would describe the KKK as approved by the Masons or even a part of the Masons. In 1921, the Grand Lodge of Kentucky adopted a resolution condemning the Ku Klux Klan, and in 1923, the Grand Master published his edict against the KKK as "an organization teaching practices contrary to the principles of Masonry. At Grand Lodge that year, a roll call vote confirmed the Grand Master's edict.

No longer limiting its hate to blacks, it now included Jews, Catholics and immigrants and targeted anyone that did not meet their specification. The term "100% American" meant far more than born an American. It became the by-word of the Klan. This revised Ku Klux Klan organization was far more ruthless than the original, buying politicians, organizing raids, raping women, murdering blacks and their white



sympathizers. Between 1930 and 1940, due to scandals, internal problems and a poor reputation, membership slipped to under 50,000 about 1% of the previous high. In 1944, the federal government charged the Klan with not paying taxes. The Klan's membership continued to decline.

In opposition to civil rights legislature, the Klan again attempted to rebuild itself in 1955. It still exists today, but in unrelated and unorganized groups, each claiming the direct descendant of the original. Membership includes skinheads, and self-proclaimed Nazi's. In 2019 the Southern Poverty Law Center stated that there were fifteen hate groups in Kentucky, four of which identify as Ku Klux Klan related. It is hard to believe that the Ku Klux Klan ever existed in the past, let alone today. The Grand Lodge of Kentucky's condemnation still exists. —--What do you think.

Greetings Brothers,

By the time you read this message we will be five months into the current situation. My hope is that each of you are doing well and staying safe.

As the July email from Ill. Bro. Randolph Starks stated the Valley of Louisville leadership deemed it necessary to continue the closure of our building through at least September

1st. This action was not taken lightly and was made after much discussion. With the current pandemic and other events making it unsafe in the area around our building we deemed it prudent to delay our meetings. We want to thank you for your understanding, and we look forward to when we can meet once again. If circumstances go well our first meeting in September will be our annual awards to those who have served the Scottish Rite for 25 and 50 years.

As mentioned earlier in this note the leadership in the Valley made the decision concerning the current situation. As we know, in the Scottish Rite everything comes from the top down unlike the Blue Lodge where everything comes from the Craft up. However, what must be understood concerning the leadership in our Valley, as well as the rest of the Scottish Rite, is that leaders must be developed and mentored. It is a necessity in any organization. A person does not become a leader merely by showing up and taking the office. There must be some form of training.

There are leaders in many of the areas of our Valley. We have the Scottish Rite Guard, the Knights of St. Andrew, the Kitchen Crew, the Welcoming committee, the Robing room group, the stage crew, the choir, the ritual cast, and each of the four bodies within the Valley which have leaders. Each leader spent time learning the position they currently hold.

One essential key to the development of leaders is the passing of knowledge. As many who have passed through the various Reunion classes can tell you, I often speak of useless knowledge. This is knowledge which we have learned and yet do not pass along to the next generation. An example that I use of useless knowledge is that of the Great Pyramids. The knowledge of how they were built was not passed down, so it has become lost and useless. The Scottish Rite teaches in many of its degrees that we are to be willing to pass along our Masonic knowledge to Brothers who are willing to learn. If we do not it becomes useless and lost. This knowledge can be as simple as how to open the building, how to run a meeting, how to plan activities, how to plan a calendar. It is one of the reasons for the Master Craftsman program which is designed to pass along the knowledge that the Scottish Rite has attained over its illustrious history.

One key to being a good leader is to be willing to listen to all opinions. It allows you to evaluate a situation to make a proper decision. Listening to the concerns and ideas of others also helps you to become a better leader as you begin to understand the needs and wants of the members. While we have traditions that we continue we must be willing to look for new ways to keep our organization current and relevant in society. Many years ago, the Scottish Rite leadership listened to members and thus was developed the Child Language Disorders program funded by the members of our organization. Another key to being a good leader is to work yourself out of a job.
