Thanksgiving is soon approaching and our Fraternity is one of the many things that I am extremely thankful for. How wonderful that we can call one another brother! Sam and I wish each one of you and your families a blessed holiday. I encourage you to take the time to reach out to our shut-in brothers and Masonic widows. Please let them know that they are not forgotten, and that we are thankful for them also.

I will share the upcoming programs with you in this issue:

I am starting the Grand Lodge Masonic Leadership Academy this month. I will continue the 4-part course in February, June, and September of 2022. This is an excellent opportunity for brothers who are interested in becoming leaders in their lodges, or aspire to be District Deputies, Grand Lodge Officers, or simply want to further their education. The Academy will have extremely knowledgeable teachers! I hope that you will participate, as I feel that it will assist in the continuing excellence of our Fraternity.

I am proud to promote the Grand Master's Grant Program. I will be awarding (2) \$2,500.00 grants to lodges for their lodge improvements. Any lodge may apply for these grants and the criteria for qualifying is outlined in the grant application. For more information, please contact the Grant Committee.

We will offer a Ritual Competition this year and I'm excited that the Entered Apprentices and Fellowcrafts will be able to participate. The competitions will be on the Entered Apprentice charge, the Fellowcraft charge and the Master Mason charge. I hope that we have several entries for each competition, as our committee travels the state to observe and judge what I know will be quality work! We will award plaques for each winner at all six locations, and a "Ritualist of the Year", will be awarded at the Annual Grand Lodge Session in Bowling Green, KY in October of 2022.

This year, First Lady Sam's program is focused on raising awareness about human trafficking. We have partnered with the P.A.T.H. Coalition (Parents Against Trafficking Humans). This is a very real and prevalent danger. Sam and I want to do our part to stop these horrendous acts from occurring in Kentucky. I ask each of you to please support her program. You can be the key to bringing awareness of human trafficking to our communities.

I am so excited to let you know that for the first time in Kentucky Masonic history, I'm launching a social media public information campaign using the slogan, "Not Just a Man, a Mason", using print and video materials. We are hoping that this will raise awareness about who we are and what we stand for. This will not be soliciting for memberships, but rather letting others know about the relevancy of Freemasonry.

The new year holds many exciting challenges and I urge you to take part as we all work together in the continued advancement of our beloved Fraternity!

As we draw close to December, please remember that your elections cannot be conducted in November as they will be considered null and void per the Book of Constitutions. #### **Veterans' Corner**

The Grand Lodge Scholarship Program will continue to help change to lives of students across the Commonwealth to help them create a positive future.

The Veterans program will support so many of our wonderful veterans for their sacrifices and service to our country.


## Jerusalem Lodge #9

"I Didn't Know That....."


Not taught in our school systems and unaware by most of the citizenship as well as, many Masons, the Constitution of the United States and the Federal style of government have a direct link to Freemasonry. That is a pretty strong statement, so is it true? Not only is it true, a comparison of the principals of government in Anderson's Constitution and the U.S. Constitution shows that they are remarkably the same. Fortunately for Freemasonry, a number of academics are beginning to look at Freemasonry and finding fascinating results.

Dr. Patrick Mendez, a visiting foreign policy scholar (John Hopkins University) writes in his book, "Commercial Providence: The Secret Destiny of the American Empire", the following: "The basic principles of the governance employed by the Masons include: "1) The grand lodge is supreme in the Masonic federal system, 2) Local lodges are self-governing and independent, 3) The selection of officers is carried out by secret vote using a ballot and elections, 4) Governance is limited by the Constitution, 5) The popular sovereignty of representative government and majority rule are fundamental 6) Fiscal responsibility is delegated to the legislative body, 7) A type of judicial review is conducted by the grand lodge and 8) Freedoms of speech and equal participation are hallmarks of Freemasonry".

After the Grand Lodge of London and Wales was formed in 1717, Rev. James Anderson with assistance from J.T. Desagulier and George Payne, published his Constitutions in 1723, and subsequently other revised editions. Anderson's Constitutions displayed a federal government for the lodge members never before used by any known government or organization. All members who attended a Lodge had a say as well as a vote, and each Lodge practiced self- government. The individual lodges then sent representatives to the Grand Lodge to conduct the business of matters applicable to the Lodges as a group.

So how did these enlightenment ideas find their way to the New England colonies and then to the Constitution of United States? In 1734, printer Benjamin Franklin reproduced Anderson's 1723 Constitutions. These were sold and distributed to both Masons and the public. Although other individuals or groups may have had some similar ideas, the Freemasons were by far the largest and the most involved in civic affairs. There is just no other group found in American history during this period that practiced such ideas.

The famous cartoon with the snake broken in eight parts having the initials of the colonies on each section and slogan "Join or Die" appeared in Franklin's newspaper the Pennsylvania Gazette, in May, 1754. It was quickly picked up by other papers. The Albany Plan of Union, incorporating the enlightenment ideals found in Anderson's Constitution, was presented by Ben Franklin at the Albany Congress in New York on July 10, 1754. The plan was to create a unified government for the American Colonies", but remain under English rule. The plan failed, out of fear of some colonies, of being 'controlled'; but would rise again twenty years later in the 2nd Continental Congress in July 1775. Fellow delegate Thomas Jefferson then made written suggestions on his copy of Franklin's plan. Congress would make made 86 edits retaining much of Franklin's original concept, before ratifying the Declaration of Independence on July 4th, 1776.



The U.S. Constitutional Convention brought together ideas from many people. The Articles of Confederation and Declaration of Independence and other documents were all studied. George Washington presided over the Convention. The Constitution of the United States was ratified in June 21, 1788. Many of the Founding Fathers had made significant contributions. Over 20% of the 58 signers, are known to be Freemasons. The Bill of Rights guaranteeing civil rights and liberties to individuals, was approved by Congress and later ratified on December 25, 1791

Some scholars trace the principals set down in the U.S. Constitution to the greatest of English philosophers John Locke (1632-1704). John Locke's ideas were an important influence on the Declaration of Independence. Locke's contract theory of government was restated by Thomas Jefferson when he wrote in the 'Declaration' that governments derived "their just Powers from the consent of the people." Locke's opposition to the 'divine right of Kings' had greatly influenced the Glorious Revolution of 1688. In his "The Second Treatise of Government, Locke states that sovereignty resides in the people and then explains natural rights and the social contract. He is also famous for calling for the separation of Church and State in his Letter Concerning Toleration, in his opposition of total rule of church, of King or any government. He believed man was intended to use reason in the search after truth rather than simply accept the opinion of authorities. Does this sound Masonic to you??

Nowhere is there a written or authenticated statement that John Locke was a Freemason, however two letters written to his friend Dr. Molyneaux (March 30, 1696/July 2, 1696) indicates that he may have been. Another letter from Locke to Thomas Earl of Pembroke, dated May 6, 1696, that having reviewed an old masonic document he intended to enter fraternity on his next visit to London. He was living near London at the time.

Regardless of 'who is and who isn't' a Freemason, we can be very proud of Freemasonry's contribution to the most important documents in American history, if not the world. As the Lee Greenwood song goes: "I'm proud to be an American where at least I know I'm free". Perhaps the second verse should be a Masonic version "I am proud of my Freemasonry that made our America free"!!






