

Greetings my Brothers!

April is here, and as we enjoy the changing of the seasons, I am so happy to see many of you at our District Meetings. One of the most enjoyable aspects about our Fraternity is the ability to fellowship and spend time with our brothers, renewing old friendships and making new ones.

This month, I want to discuss the importance of the Ashlars. As an artist, I was asked how I knew what to draw on my sketchpad. My response was that the drawing was already there, that I had just put pencil or ink to it so everyone else could see and enjoy it as I do. That premise is based on the idea that there is always something wonderful in each of us, waiting to be seen by others. All we have to do is allow others to see it in our actions, deeds, and behavior. Like the rough Ashlar, we enter this world in a rudimentary state, being influenced and driven by our surroundings. Growing to adulthood, we have a lifetime of experiences that form our beliefs and our behavior, thus making us like the rough Ashlar that was formed by the elements and the geography from whence it came. Like the rough Ashlar, we are formed and shaped by things around us and things we choose to surround ourselves with. If we are surrounded by negative things, it will show in our conduct, behavior, and appearances. By surrounding ourselves with positives such as like-minded people, a positive environment, and positive influences, we have a tendency to exude the positive aspects we have absorbed; we become more like the perfect ashlar. Freemasonry teaches us to break off those rough edges, and divest ourselves of the things that keep us from being the best versions of ourselves. We strive every day to be better men. Through the encouragement of our families and our brothers, we continue through our character, conduct and commitment to improve in our behavior, our standards, and in our influence.

We are taught that the Rough Ashlar "is a stone as taken from the quarry in its rude and natural state". The Rough Ashlar was not a stone that was merely picked up somewhere. It was a stone that has been selected. Some work was done upon it. It was apparently a good stone. It was a stone that showed good prospects of being capable of being made into a Perfect Ashlar. If it had not been a good stone, it would never have been cut out from the quarry. I want to emphasize that each of you are in this Fraternity for a reason. We choose to stand apart from the rest of society because of who we are and what we stand for. Each of us are being shaped by our friendships, our fellowship and our tenets. You all represent that Ashlar, constantly breaking off the rough edges and forming into something useful and important. I am so proud to know each of you, and I know that you have the ability to be the best versions of yourselves. Not everyone will become that perfect Ashlar, but the essential thing is to have a good material upon which to work. May the great Architect bless you and I look forward to seeing you in my future travels.





In this article of the Masonic Home Journal, I want to share an experience I had last year at the Valley of Louisville during Honors weekend. It encourages me as a Mason to strive to grow and be a man of good character.

Illustrious Sir Bob Bradley, 33° has been an active brother in the masonic fraternity for many years. However, like some of the brothers he suffers from failing health recently and has not always been able to attend meetings. After his nomination and election to receive his 33°, discussion arose about conferring the work upon Bob in a private ceremony because of concerns he wouldn't be able to make the journey to Louisville, or if he would live long enough to receive the degree. Several brothers were willing to do whatever needed to be done to make sure this conferral was possible. When I approached Bob with the idea, allowing him an easier path, he declined saying, "I think I can make it." Each month I would check on him to see how he was doing, and he stayed the course.

When the day of the Conferral finally arrived, Bob was in attendance. Usually, after the class receives their Honors, a picture is taken of each individual downstairs in the basement. Bob was in his wheelchair, and someone came to tell me he was really feeling bad and would have to leave soon. Fortunately, Illustrious Sir Edward "Doc" Anderson, 33° was present. Doc borrowed the photographer's camera and took Bob's picture. I said to Bob, "you know you didn't have to put yourself through all of this today; we would have gladly come to you." Bob replied, "It was enough of an honor being nominated by my brothers that thought I was worthy, the least I could do was show up."

<u>Now that will preach, Brothers.</u> I was instantly humbled being in his presence. I would guess he rode 6 hours or more that day, and I can only imagine the pain he endured. Sometimes after working all day I don't feel like going to a meeting because I'm tired. I won't ever complain again.



Remember the obligation we all took.







# LODGES IN WHITLEY COUNTY FORM PARTNERSHIP WITH RETIRED TEACHERS TO MEET STUDENT NEEDS
