

Greetings Brothers,

As I write this article, I'm reminded of all the wonderful brothers that I have had the privilege of sitting with in lodges, at the District Meetings, and the various Grand Jurisdictions I've had the honor to visit. Masonically, they represent the pursuit of a well-grounded hope and a well-spent life. We have a propensity to look upon life as a voyage, sometimes fraught with storms, and we rely on our faith as an anchor to keep us steadfast and stable, to provide us firmness and hope. The Ark we see symbolically as the source to keep us afloat in life's deluge of uncertainty when things feel overwhelming. It also represents the assurance that our Supreme Architect will carry us safely through the turmoil and tempests of life.

The acronym ARK also stands for an Act of Random Kindness. As Masons, I want to challenge you to perform an act of random kindness in your community. I am sure there are people in your neighborhoods or communities or anywhere you may be traveling, that are suffering with something in their lives. SEEKING NOMINATIONS

The Annual Meeting of Masonic Homes Kentucky will be held on Monday, Oct. 17, 2022. Five Directors will be elected to serve a three-year term.

To be eligible for election to the office of director, you must be a Kentucky Master Mason. Directors are expected to attend bi-monthly Board meetings every third Wednesday, serve on assigned committees and perform other duties as assigned by the Chair of the Board or Executive Committee. Directors serve without remuneration and must own a Life Membership or Honorary Life Membership (\$250) to Masonic Homes Kentucky. Members are also encouraged to make a contribution to Masonic's Masonicare program each year of their service.

To be considered for nomination to the Board of Directors, you must submit a current resume including: name, address, current occupation, phone number, education and work experience, previous board experience, organizational offices held, references and Masonic affiliation and history. 




"I Didn't Know That....."

George Washington, the Father of our Country, is considered the most famous American Freemason, and rightly hailed. However for 20 years before the American Revolution, it was Benjamin Franklin (1706-1790) who was the world's most famous American Freemason. Did you ever wonder how Boston born Brother Ben Franklin ever became interested in Freemasonry?

It seems that even in his early years while living in Philadelphia, Ben Franklin always had a penchant for self-improvement and he endeavored to improve the community in which he lived. In fact Franklin was just 21 years of age when he gathered a group of friends to form the "Junto" or "Leather Apron Club". Most of the group were self-employed or held various labor occupations, but they had an interest helping the community and for mutual improvement. Franklin's congeniality and being a printer by trade, allowed him to meet a large group of people, from whom he would select on their merit, a few to become a member of the group.

Franklin describes the formation and purpose of the Junto in his autobiography:

"I should have mentioned before, that, in the autumn of the preceding year, [1727] I had form'd most of my ingenious acquaintance into a club of mutual improvement, which we called the Junto; we met on Friday evenings. The rules that I drew up required that every member, in his turn, should produce one or more queries on any point of Morals, Politics, or Natural Philosophy, to be discuss'd by the company; and once in three months produce and read an essay of his own writing, on any subject he pleased.



Our debates were to be under the direction of a president, and to be conducted in the sincere spirit of inquiry after truth, without fondness for dispute or desire of victory; and to prevent warmth, all expressions of positiveness in opinions, or direct contradiction, were after some time made contraband, and prohibited under small pecuniary penalties."

Any person to be qualified as a member was to stand up, lay his hand upon his chest, over his heart, and be asked the following questions, viz.

- 1. Have you any particular disrespect to any present members? *Answer*. I have not.
- 2. Do you sincerely declare that you love mankind in general, of what profession or religion soever? *Answer*. I do.
- 3. Do you think any person ought to be harmed in his body, name, or goods, for mere speculative opinions, or his external way of worship? *Answer*. No.
- 4. Do you love truth for truth's sake, and will you endeavor impartially to find and receive it yourself, and communicate it to others? *Answer*. Yes.

Except for the 'politics' in the 'purpose', this should sound very familiar to Freemasons. Brother Ben further devised a list of 24 questions of helping the community, helping others in need, morals, self-improvement and networking to be considered at every Friday meeting. All the above indicates Benjamin Franklin was certainly predisposed to Freemasonry.

Four years later, Ben Franklin became a Freemason at the age of 24 years in 1727. Franklin re-printed "Anderson's Constitutions" three years later. The principles contained in the 1723. Masonic constitutions would later be reflected in the Constitution of the United States of which Franklin was very instrumental. In fact, Franklin was the only person to sign the three major documents of the United States of America: The Declaration of Independence, the Treaty of Paris, and the United States Constitution.

It was also Benjamin Franklin who succeeded in persuading the French to support the American independence movement.. Without that support, many historians agree, the War for Independence would have been lost.

Ben Franklin served Pennsylvania as Grand Master and as Provincial Grand Master. He held many Grand Lodge offices as well as in his own lodge. Benjamin Franklin was later honored by his Pennsylvania brethren for his over 50 years of distinguished service to Freemasonry and his country. Benjamin Franklin's service to his country as a politician, scientist, inventor, philosopher and diplomat is indisputable.


S. Brent Morris 33° Grand Cross

I hope our message finds you in good health and spirits as we move forward toward normalcy after two years of the recent pandemic.


