

FIRST AID KITS

Many of you had the opportunity to hear our Most Worshipful Grand Master E. Darren Wilson speak at the District Meetings about how the contents of a small first aid kit can make a significant difference to an individual in need. One of the most effective steps you can take to improve the Lodge's preparedness is to purchase or assemble a first aid kit.

First aid kits of various shapes and sizes can be purchased from retailers near you, such as a pharmacy. You can also make your own using the recommended contents list below for reference.

- 2 absorbent compress dressings (5 x 9 inches)
- 25 adhesive bandages (assorted sizes), also found within our Family First Aid Kit
- 1 adhesive cloth tape (10 yards x 1 inch)
- 5 antibiotic ointment packets (approximately 1 gram)

- 5 antiseptic wipe packets
- 2 packets of aspirin (81 mg each)
- 1 emergency blanket
- 1 breathing barrier (with one-way valve)
- 1 instant cold compress
- 2 pair of nonlatex gloves (size: large)
- 2 hydrocortisone ointment packets (approximately 1 gram each)

- 1 3 in. gauze roll (roller) bandage
- 1 roller bandage (4 inches wide)
- 5 3 in. x 3 in. sterile gauze pads
- 5 sterile gauze pads (4 x 4 inches)
- Oral thermometer (non-mercury/ non-glass)
- 2 triangular bandages
- Tweezers
- Emergency First Aid instructions

Try to include any items that may be useful for unique circumstances, such as an EpiPen if you are aware of someone with extreme allergies. Finally, don't forget to check the kit regularly for items to be replaced due to use or expiration.







MASONIC LIBRARY AND MUSEUM ASSOCIATION COVINGTON SCOTTISH RITE "I Didn't Know That....."

Definitely one of the most religious of the Masonic orders is the "Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priest." The 'invitational only' order is conferred upon Christian Templar Knights, who have served as the Commander of their respective Commandery. Membership in a "Tabernacle" is limited to 33, thus restricting itself to only the most dedicated and long serving York Rite members. Kentucky has two such Tabernacles, Golgotha XIV, and Centurion LXXVI. Beside the Preceptor, seven officers are styled as 'pillars' (Proverbs 9:1 Wisdom has built her house/she has set up its seven pillars).

The ceremonies draw upon the basic teachings and allegories found in Masonic tradition and instruct on the importance of virtue, humility and devotion to God, resulting in spiritual enlightenment to the candidate. The regalia and jewels of the Order are also spiritually symbolic. As a member of the Priestly Order, one does not minister to the public, but should nurture the principles of chivalry and the pursuit of spiritual growth.

The history of this exclusive Christian Order is confusing. Like many of the eighteenth century Masonic degrees, it is found under many names: *White Masons, Priestly Order, Templar Masons*, are a few that have met in Melchizedek Lodges, White Lodges, Holy Wisdom Conclaves, Conventions, Union Bands, Tabernacles, etc. The old Knight Templar Priest rituals vary somewhat in content and at least one has no relation at all, to today's American ritual.

English Masonic historian John Yarker states that the degree, "*Priestly Order*" was practiced in Ireland under the York Grand Lodge, while Masonic scholar and author William James Hughan believed that the *Knights Templar Priest or Holy Wisdom* was not 'York' at all. Arthur Edward Waite writes that the degree *Priestly Order or White Mason* was conferred under the Early Grand Scottish Rite. Yarker also believes that the degree was first conferred in 1686, but records do not appear until almost 100 years later.

Perhaps Harold V.B. Voorhis' history from <u>"Proceedings of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Missouri – 1957</u>" is the most reliable. Ireland appears to be the country of origin, possibly around 1770, and later found in Manchester, England (May 20, 1795). Old minutes from 1812-1816 in Manchester state in their history, "The degree of United Sacred Band of Royal Arch Knights Templar Priests is an old York degree, as they printed warrants first in 1786..." and goes on to say, "The degree with the Bands or Unwarranted Encampment dated its year from the year of the Revival, or 1686, and it is interesting to read the names of the members of the Priestly Order and, as in many cases gives the occupations."

Save for English *Royal Kent Tabernacle* in Newcastle, organized in 1809, the Order nearly ceased its existence in the mid nineteenth century, as other tabernacles in England, Ireland and Scotland were no longer functioning. In 1923, the *Royal Kent Tabernacle* would form the Grand College of England to issue warrants for eighteen tabernacles.

Interestingly, an 1829 document in the archives of the Northern Jurisdiction of the Scottish Rite, is a notice of the *Priestly Order*. On the other side of the document is a record of two meetings of the Order of High Priesthood. Kentucky Mason Frederick Weber, who served the Supreme Council Southern Jurisdiction for 48 years as either

Treasurer-General or Secretary-General, had in his possession, a notice of a meeting of the *Priestly Order* dated 1840. Another notice, dated October 19, 1897, reveals that Illustrious Weber conferred the degree on Brother Millard R. Hicks, in Washington D.C., who returned to Maine and conferred the same on six more candidates.

Unaware of the previous American history, the order officially came to the United States on May 14, 1933, with the forming of "*The Great Priory of America, Priestly Order of the Temple*" with John Raymond Shutte II, as the Grand Preceptor. Later it would arrive in Kentucky in 1946 under the direction of Conrad Cates, with *Golgotha XIV Tabernacle* formally erected on February 10, 1949 and *Centurion Tabernacle LXXVI*, erected on February 2, 1996.

The HRAKTP has since been highly prized, with five Kentuckians serving as Grand Preceptor of the Grand College of America, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests. It has been my pleasure to associate with each of these fine gentlemen and outstanding Masons.

Grand Preceptors from Kentucky include: Wylie B. Wendt (1957) author/editor of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar Tactics; Charles K.A, McCaughey (1975) a Past Grand High Priest who served many years as Grand Secretary of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Kentucky; Donald H. Smith (1991) after serving as Grand Commander of Kentucky went on to be elected as the Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, USA; and William G. Hinton (2003) who served as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky

as well as Grand Commander of Knights Templar. Our current Grand Preceptor is J. William Riggs (2023-2024). He served as both Grand Commander of Kentucky Knights Templar and Grand High Priest of Kentucky Royal Arch Masons. Bill totally dedicates himself to all Masonic bodies on the local, state and national level. He also works diligently to promote their philanthropies. Congratulations to you Billy Riggs. We wish you the very best during your major accomplishment this year in your Masonic life.




