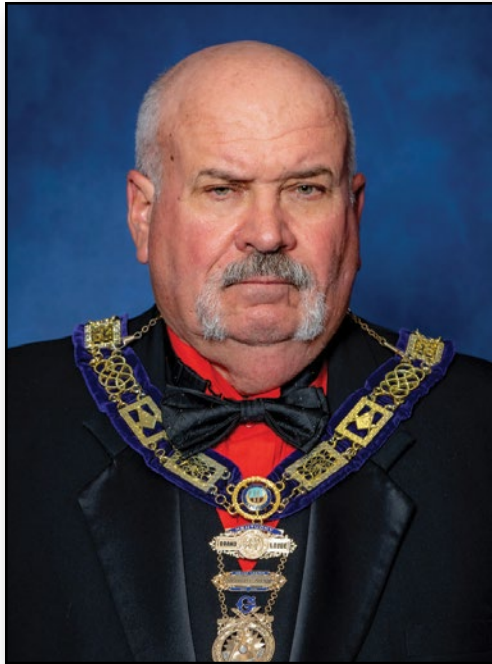

SEEKING NOMINATIONS

The Annual Meeting of Masonic Homes Kentucky will be held on Monday, Oct. 21, 2024. Five Directors will be elected to serve a three-year term.

To be eligible for election to the office of director, you must be a Kentucky Master Mason. Directors are expected to attend bi-monthly Board meetings every third Wednesday, serve on assigned committees and perform other duties as assigned by the Chair of the Board or Executive Committee. Directors serve without remuneration and must own a Life Membership or Honorary Life Membership (\$250) to Masonic Homes Kentucky. 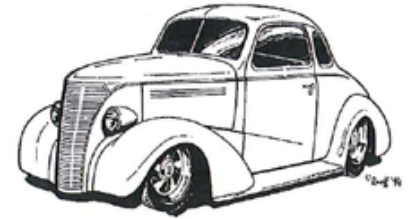

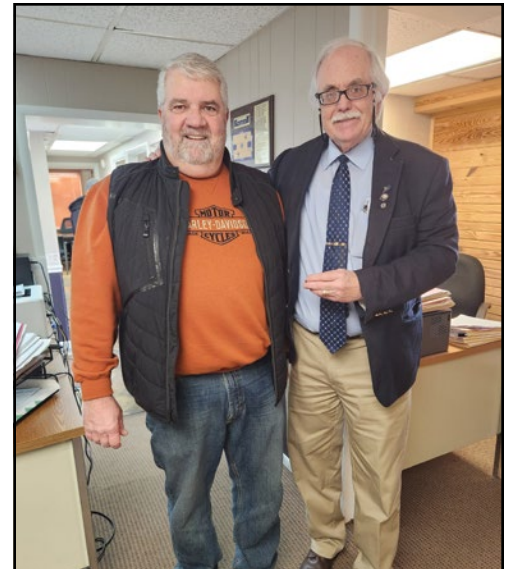

"I Didn't Know That....."

It may surprise many Kentucky Masons to learn that Louisville Scottish Rite was once a Grand Consistory. At the request of Brother Fredric Webber, Albert G. Macke of the Supreme Council came to Louisville and communicated the 4th thru 32nd degrees on eight Kentuckians on August 18, 1852. Three days later on August 21, Macke organized the Grand Consistory of Kentucky. In 1853, Macke communicated the Scottish Rite degrees on Albert Pike who would become Sovereign Grand Commander of the Supreme Council and through his leadership, transform the Scottish Rite into a powerful organization that would grow to be known as the University of Freemasonry.

According to Kentucky Masonic historian Charles Snow Guthrie, Henry W. Gray became the first Grand Commander of the Kentucky Grand Consistory, serving until November, 1858, when Rob Morris assumed the post. An active York Rite Mason, Morris showed little interest in the emerging body, serving but one year. Fred Webber, Grand Secretary, then succeeded Morris, but Webber enlisted in the Union Army during the Civil War, and the Grand Consistory of Kentucky became dark and had to be reorganized in Louisville January 9, 1867. Fred Webber would go on to serve the Supreme Council as Treasurer-General in 1871-1886 and then as Secretary-General until his death in 1907. His membership and service to the Supreme Council of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction extended over 48 years, unmatched to this date.

Initially, Pike favored the Grand Consistory system, first mentioned in the Constitutions of 1786, but later he became discouraged, abolishing all but two Grand Consistories; Louisiana and Kentucky. In 1911, the Supreme Council repealed the administrative power of both Grand Consistories, but they were allowed to maintain their title as 'Grand Consistories.' The Grand Consistory of Kentucky, holding the oldest Consistory charter in continual existence, was renamed Louisville Consistory in January 15, 1971.

The reorganization of 1867, proved favorable to Kentucky's Grand Consistory, with Masons from across the state, traveling to Louisville to receive the Scottish Rite degrees. In 1885, the Grand Consistory of Kentucky authorized Delta Lodge of Perfection, to confer the fourth thru fourteenth degrees in Covington, Kentucky. The original ritual, titled *"The Inner Sanctuary, Part 1"* (1870 edition), contains the degrees 4th through 14th, and is signed by Albert Pike, Sovereign Grand Commander. It is currently in possession of the Covington Masonic Library. Only one such ritual was presented to each Lodge of Perfection.

In Covington, Khesvan Chapter Rose Croix would soon be included in their conferrals but for one to receive the Council degrees (19th -30th) and Consistory degrees (31st-32nd), he would have to travel to Louisville. The rapid growth of membership allowed Fred Weber Council and Indra Consistory to be chartered in Covington on September 13, 1909. Years later, West Kentucky Consistory in Madisonville would be chartered on October 24, 1963; and Lexington Consistory chartered on October 18, 1971.

Unfortunately, not all was good news for Kentucky Masonry. Besides the anti-Masonic movement of 1826-1832, the second most harm came to Freemasonry came through the attempted establishment of *"Cerneauism."* Degree peddlers have been around since the forming

of the Grand Lodge of London. *"Cerneauism"* which mainly plagued the Scottish Rite, became a derogatory term used to describe the establishment of illegitimate Masonic organizations. Named for Joseph Cerneau, a jeweler serving as Deputy Grand Inspector for Northern Cuba, he was authorized only to confer the 4th thru 25th degrees in Cuba. Scottish Rite historian William L. Fox writes that in 1807, Cerneau moved from Cuba to New York and ignoring his lack of authority, established a Sovereign Grand Consistory of Sublime Princes of the Royal Secret. Antoine Bideaud, a member of the Scottish Rite in the French West India Islands, had previously organized a Supreme Council in New York by unknown authority. A bitter rivalry of the two Consistories was created. This would extend from personal arguments and conflict, into politics as high as the office of Governor of New York. The Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction, Mother Supreme Council of the World, granted authorization to the Bideaud Council August 5, 1813, to establish the Supreme Council for the Northern Jurisdiction. The official certificate of authorization would not arrive until January 7, 1815.

Unfazed by the recognition of their adversary, the Cerneau Grand Consistory continued their battle and competition with their foes. The Cerneau body began conferring 32 degrees and changed their name to *Grand Consistory of the United States*. In addition, although never a Knight Templar, Cerneau established a Grand Encampment of New York. To this he added other degrees. *Cerneauism* was a degree mill, selling degrees and titles, to anyone who would buy them. Eventually, in 1867, the Cerneau bodies would join the Northern Jurisdiction. Unfortunately, feelings of some Cerneau members were so prevalent, they did not approve union and reestablished the Cerneau bodies.

Kentucky would not escape the invasion of *Cerneauism*. About 1887, spurious Consistories were established in Louisville, Lexington, Covington and Frankfort with a membership of about 300. They met in Lexington to form a Grand Consistory, electing James L. Watson (Lexington #1) as their Grand Master. In 1888, Kentucky Grand Master J. Soule Smith stated that the 'Pike Rite' (The Southern Jurisdiction) had jurisdiction over Kentucky Scottish Rite originally, and the Cerneau bodies were irregular and illegal. Grand Master Smith was not a member of the Scottish Rite. Other states would proclaim the same. Most of those who had joined the fraudulent Kentucky body, did not understand that it was bogus until after Grand Master Smith's proclamation. Most would quickly resign.

The problem caused both the York and Scottish Rite bodies in 1891, to declare that their membership was dependent upon holding membership in a regular lodge of Freemasons. It was found that a clandestine body was accepting suspended and expelled Masons. In 1900, MWGM John Alexander Ramsey voiced that 33 spurious lodges in Ohio and Kentucky had organized as a Grand Lodge. The Jurisprudence Committee found a *Grand Lodge of Ancient York Masons of Kentucky* had been incorporated in Covington on November 21, 1899, consisting of three Kentucky lodges and a Royal Arch Chapter. Actually nothing could be done as the Grand Lodge of Kentucky had no authority outside of their subordinate lodges. Eventually, these clandestine bodies would fail, ending a turbulent time in Kentucky Freemasonry.What do you think?
