My Brothers,

In the fall of 1998, I entered the fifth grade at Majestic-Knox Creek Elementary School, with Mrs. Lois Lester as my teacher. One vivid memory from that year stands out as formative in shaping my character: my mother's decidedly unhappy response to my first report card of the year. As I entered adolescence, I had allowed my studies to falter, failing to meet the standard of diligence my parents had come to expect. The resulting disappointment from my father and my mother's firm but loving persuasion served as a wake up call. I quickly



realized that my attention had wandered toward what was entertaining rather than what was essential, and this course correction set me back on a path toward responsibility and growth.

That lesson, learned at the early age of ten, continues to carry deep meaning for me even now as an adult and as a Freemason. In life, and especially within our Craft, it is easy to lose focus on the true work before us. We may become distracted by diversions—pursuing prestige, recognition, titles, or some illusory sense of self-importance. These temptations are the "bright and shiny lights" that divert us from the principles and tenets that define us as Masons. When we allow this drift to occur, we forget our deeper purpose: we are all rough ashlars taken from the quarry, striving daily to be shaped and refined so that, one day, we may find a proper place in the spiritual building not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

During my time as Master of my mother lodge, I learned the closing charge – a powerful admonition given near the end of each meeting. It reminds us of a duty that is both sobering and uplifting: we are to solemnly remind our Brothers of their errors and aid in their reformation. This charge is not a call to humiliation or public rebuke; far from it. Rather, it instructs us to offer gentle counsel – to whisper words of guidance into a Brother's ear and extend a hand to steady him when he stumbles. Such an approach recognizes a universal truth: every one of us, at some point, has erred and fallen short of the obligations we undertook as Freemasons.

Yet acknowledging this truth does not excuse continued failure. Once we are made aware of conduct incompatible with our principles, we are duty bound to reform it. Persistent behavior contrary to our obligations is not only un-Masonic but ultimately intolerable to the harmony of the Craft. The fraternal bond we share demands mutual accountability – not out of judgment, but out of love for one another and respect for the sacred principles we profess.

Correction, whether in childhood or adulthood, is rarely comfortable. A ten-year-old boy may resist his parents' disappointment just as a seasoned Mason may bristle when approached by a Brother offering fraternal counsel. Yet such correction is essential for growth. It may come through private reflection – a quiet inventory of our own actions and motives – or it may arrive through the gentle nudge of a Brother who sees us straying from the path. In either case, the proper response is humility: to listen, to reflect, and to make the necessary adjustments, chipping away at the rough corners of our spiritual ashlar.

In the end, this work of refinement is lifelong. None of us can say with certainty when the Grand Architect will call for our stone to be placed into His eternal Temple. That uncertainty should inspire urgency in our labors. Each day presents an opportunity to prepare – to smooth our rough edges, correct our missteps, and draw ever closer to the ideals set before us in the Craft.

My childhood report card was a minor moment in the grand scheme of life, but its lesson endures: discipline, humility, and the willingness to accept correction are indispensable to personal growth. As Freemasons, let us take that lesson to heart. Let us remain vigilant against distraction, mindful of our obligations, and receptive to the counsel of our Brothers. And when our time comes to be fitted into that celestial lodge above, may our ashlars be found true and worthy of the place prepared for them. Though refinement of the rude and imperfect stone taken from the quarry may appear daunting at first glance, with time, patience, and perseverance we shall accomplish all things!

### GRAND HISTORIAN'S NOTES

My Brothers,

While reading through the biographies of our Past Grand Masters, I stumbled upon the entry of our senior living Past Grand Master, Most Worshipful Carroll M. Curtis. As long as I, and many of you, have been attending Masonic functions throughout the state, Brother Curtis has always been there sharing his wisdom and love for the Craft. So, I thought it would be fitting to share a little about his life, and hope you find it both educational and enjoyable!



Carroll Milton Curtis was born and reared on a farm near Piqua in Robertson County, Kentucky, on September 01, 1931 to Mr. and Mrs. Ray Curtis. He was the third of a family of seven children, and was educated in the public schools of Robertson County and the University of Kentucky.

After a number of years in the engineering field, he became associated with the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company and was later a Special Agent of that Company, with an office in Frankfort, moving there in April 1967. He was a member and past Secretary-Treasurer of the Frankfort Association of Life Underwriters and a member of the Kentucky and National Associations of Life Underwriters.

A believer that man's first duty is to God, Brother Curtis was at one time a member of the Piqua Christian Church, and later he became a member of the Apostolic Faith, and was called to the ministry. During the Korean War, Brother Curtis served our Country in the United States Air Force (1950-1954), and was deployed to Korea.

After petitioning Mount Olivet Lodge No. 291, F. & A.M. and being elected to receive the degrees, Brother Curtis was initiated as an Entered Apprentice on June 07, 1954, and passed to the Degree of Fellow Craft on July 05, 1954, in Sedalia Lodge No. 236, A.F. & A.M., Sedalia, Missouri, as a courtesy. On August 09, 1954, he was raised to the sublime Degree of Master Mason in his mother lodge.

He was appointed Junior Deacon (1954-1955), and elected Junior Warden (1956-1957), Senior Warden (1957-1958), and Master in (1958-1959, 1961-1962). He later served as the Treasurer of Mount Olivet Lodge No. 291 for several terms. Brother Curtis served the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F. & A.M. as District Deputy Grand Master of District 30 (1959-60), Grand Instructor in District 30 (1960-61), Grand Pursuivant (1963-64), and on the Committee on Ritual (1966-1969), followed by several terms as a member of the Committee on Jurisprudence.

At the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge in October 1966, he was elected to the office of Grand Junior Warden. Following regular advancement through the chairs, on October 23, 1969, Most Worshipful Carroll M. Curtis was installed as Grand Master of Masons in Kentucky.

Brother Curtis attended all District Meetings throughout the state during his term, traveling thousands of miles on behalf of Masonry, teaching, speaking, and practicing all the high precepts of our great fraternity. His loyalty and devotion to our great order have been portrayed during his entire Masonic life, in his local lodge, district, and Grand Lodge activities. His loyalty, devotion, patience, and interest characterized his activities daily, striving for the true meaning and concepts of Masonry to be a meaningful part of every Mason. The sincerity of his leadership will be long remembered by those who followed him. Brother Curtis conducted many installation ceremonies in lodges throughout the state, presided at dedications of Masonic halls and temples, churches, and other buildings, presented twenty-five and fifty-year pins, and conducted himself in such a manner as to attempt to bring before all brethren the need to practice the principles of the "Brotherhood of Man and the Fatherhood of God."

On December 28, 1973, Brother Curtis married Miss Faye Moreland in Louisville, Kentucky. Together, they share four children: Brother Seth, Jennifer, Aaron, and John. In the Spring of 2021, Brother Curtis conferred each of the three Degrees of Ancient Craft Masonry upon his eldest son, Seth, and participated in his York Rite Degrees, as well. On Monday, January 20, 2025, he installed Brother Seth as Master of Georgetown Lodge No. 3.

He has lived and practiced Masonry in all ways since becoming a Mason, and his dignity, reverence, and enthusiasm for the brotherhood have been characterized in all of his activities. Today, at the age of 95, Most Worshipful Brother Curtis continues to attend almost every meeting of Mt. Olivet Lodge and, on frequent occasions, makes visits to subordinate lodges across the state. He remains active in the conferring of Degrees, having performed many sections of his sons' Degrees while nearing the age of 90. In August 2023, Grand Master E. Darren Wilson presented his 70-Year Pin before a large crowd gathered for a stated meeting held at the Fire Department in Mt. Olivet, Kentucky.



A lodge under dispensation may be established on the petition of not less than 15Master Masons, residents of the jurisdiction of the proposed new lodge, who shallfile with said petition their demits or statements of good standing, certified and sealed by the Secretaries of their lodges, and the consent of every lodge whose jurisdiction would be affected by the new lodge if established. An objection, to be valid, must be made before the preparation of the candidate in the case of initiation or advancement and before the ballot is taken in the case of affiliation. "Before the preparation of the candidate" shall be defined as before the candidate is conducted to the preparation room.

- (2) Objection to advancement shall prevent the candidate from receiving the de- gree for six months from the date the objection is, or should have been noted in the minutes: and after the expiration of six months the candidate may be advancedupon request without formal petition, but notice shall be given of the proposed advancement in open lodge.
- (3) Objection may be renewed, or other objection made in like manner and with the same effect within one week before the end of the six-month period or any succeeding six month period.
- (4) Such objection may be made in open lodge or to the Master privately and if made at a stated communication the objection shall be noted in the minutes without giving the name of the objector; and if not made or reported at a stated communication, then in every case the objection must be noted in the minutes of the next stated communication as above provided.
- (5) The objecting brother shall not be questioned as to his reasons, but he may give them if he chooses, and if he voluntarily states his reasons in open lodge, or privately to the Master who shall preserve the identity of the Brother making the objection and shall not reveal his identity to anyone, the lodge shall pass upon the sufficiency and validity of the objection, and a majority vote by ballot shall be necessary to sustain the objection. If not sustained the lodge shall proceed with the advancement of the candidate.
- (6) Any objection to advancement may be withdrawn by the objector in open lodge, or to the Master privately and the withdrawal must be noted in the minutes at a stated communication and the candidate may then be advanced. (7) (G) Unless charges are preferred, no objection shall prevent an Entered Ap- prentice or Fellow Craft Mason from participating fully in any degree which he has attained, or having a demit issued to him as provided in ARTICLE 18,( SEC-TION- 3).

(1) An objection to initiation or affiliation may be made by a member of the lodge petitioned. If for advancement, the objection must be made by a mem- ber of his lodge. The objection can be made in open lodge or privately to the Master of the lodge. The objector must state a reason for the objection and the members present, by majority vote, will determine if the objection is valid. If the members concur with the objection, the objection for initiation or affiliation shall have precisely the same effect, in every respect, as if the objector had cast an unfavorable ballot on the petition. An objection, to be valid, must be made before the preparation of the candidate in the case of initiation or advancement and before the ballot is taken in the case of affiliation. "Before the preparation of the candidate" shall be defined as before the candidate is conducted to the prepa-ration room.

No lodge or member of the Craft may cause to be printed or distributed before or at any Grand Lodge or a subordinate lodge, any card, letter, ticket or favor foror in the interest of any candidate for office in the Grand Lodge or a subordinate lodge and the Grand Master or Master of a subordinate lodge shall not receive or entertain the nomination of any candidate where either he, his lodge, or others onhis behalf has violated this provision.

Any lodge, or group of lodges under the Jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, may host a Forum for Candidates of the office of Grand Junior War- den or a Grand Junior Warden Candidates' Forum. A Grand Junior Warden Candidates' Forum is defined as an event in which all duly declared candidates for the office of Grand Junior Warden at the subsequent Grand Lodge Annual Communication are invited to appear, are asked identical questions and are allowed equal time to respond to those questions. The Grand Master shall be notified at least 3 months prior to the Forum allowing ample time to appoint a member to monitor the event. The Grand Master's Monitor will review the ques- tions prepared by the host upon his arrival to the Forum; however, these ques- tions will not be presented to the candidates prior to the Forum. The candidates will also be required to entertain questions from the brothers in attendance with approval of the question by the Monitor. The Candidates' Forum shall not be held in a Tiled Subordinate Lodge Communication. It is the duty of the Grand Master's Monitor to ensure that the Forum and participants thereof, follow the provisions of this section and abide by the Book of Constitutions. The absence of the Grand Master's Monitor shall not serve as a sufficient cause to cancel the Forum; all other requirements having been met. There shall be no restrictions to the audio and/or video recording of the Forum.





Washington D.C., the nation's capital city, definitely has a large and interesting Masonic history that members can find especially gratifying. Our most famous brother, George Washington, commissioned Brother Pierre Charles L'Enfant (Holland #8, New York) to plan the city. Unfortunately, this has become a menu for the voice of the anti-masons to rise loud and strong, filled with exaggerated instances and false narratives.

What remains a constant in most antimasonic literature on Washington


D.C. is the "satanic" inverted pentagram that exist in the layout of the city. Oddly, an engraving "Plan of the City of Washington" made in March 1792, does show three sides of a pentagram, somewhat out of proportion. The partial figure is bordered by three octagons. The White House, Scottish Rite House of the Temple and other buildings somehow make their way into the Washington D.C. conspiracy. What could this mean? The conspirator can show you. A good imagination helps!

The pentagram is an ancient symbol dating to biblical times. In early Christian symbolism, the pentagram was used to represent the five wounds of Christ. Currently the Order of the Eastern Star, utilizes the pentagram with the third point of the star pointing down, emulating the "Star in the East" pointing to the "place of our saviors nativity."

Researchers have sought to find when the pentagram became an "evil" sign. It has been traced to the 1861 book "Doctrine and Ritual of High Magic." One point up, the pentagram means symbolically "good and light." One point down represents "evil." To date, this is the first known reference to the star being evil. The year 1861 is too late for the 1792 City of Washington Plan, or the 1850 approximate origin of Rob Morris' Eastern Star ritual.

Unfortunately, the unwarranted story of the layout of the City of Washington D.C., like the "masonic symbols" on the dollar bill, has been perpetuated by Masons themselves!

**Sandusky, Ohio** is the only city in the United States with streets laid out in Masonic symbols. In 1816, Hector Kilbourne, a surveyor and a Freemason, designed the original plan. The streets form the square and compasses (*see illustration.*) The emblem appears placed on the Holy Bible, with Columbus Street serving as its center. Huron and Central Streets form the arms of the compasses, while Elm and Poplar Streets are the sides of a mason's square.



In Sandusky, Brother Kilbourne served as the first Master of Science Lodge #50. The Lodge was chartered in July 1818. In 1889, the brethren built a beautiful building to house the several Masonic organizations of Sandusky. In 1989, the building was nominated for the National Register of Historical Places. In 2018, the City of Sandusky and Science Lodge #50, together celebrated 200 years.

During the Civil War, nearby Johnson Island held many Confederate prisoners. Science Lodge's Charity Committee made sure the prisoners received necessary clothes and other

supplies. Many of the Union soldiers serving as guards at the prison, petitioned the lodge and the Confederate prisoners who were Masons, actually attended Science Lodge meetings. Other Confederate prisoners petitioned and were initiated in the three degrees. Of course, after the lodge meeting, they returned to Johnson Island. What an amazing act of true Masonic charity and brotherly love!







#### A Cornerstone of Legacy: Masons Dedicate Clay Active Lifestyle Community at Masonic Homes Kentucky
